Highlights:

RTI attended the Beneshangul-Gumuz regional annual NTDs program review meeting held at Bambasi town from October 11-12, 2022. Regional annual NTD program performance, challenges



faced during implementation and the solutions made in the past fiscal year were major areas of discussion. An action plan was developed for the current fiscal year.

- RTI, FHF and LFTW teams participated in the Oromia regional annual NTDs plan alignment meeting held in Adama town from October 13-14, 2022. The main purpose of the meeting was to make program implementation alignment and coordination among different stakeholders working on the NTD program in the region. The Act | East team shared the annual program implementation plans and timelines with ORHB NTD team.
- RTI and LFTW participated in the 9th National Onchocerciasis Elimination Expert Advisory Committee (EOEEAC) meeting held from October 19-21, 2022, in Addis Ababa. The progress of the national onchocerciasis program toward elimination by 2030 was the major area of discussion. Implementing partners and different stakeholders shared their experiences and challenges related to onchocerciasis program implementation. RTI and LFTW presented the program performance of the Act | East project supported regions of Ethiopia.

- FHF will conduct supportive supervision activities of trachoma MDA campaign at Dhas woreda of Borena zone in November 2022 (non-USAID funded).
- RTI and WI-HER will support the organization of the GESI Behavioral change cohort follow up at Adaba district of Oromia region in collaboration with FHF and ORHB in November 2022.
- RTI will start preparatory activities for regional MDA planning meetings at Beneshangul-Gumuz and Gambella regions in December 2022.
- LFTW will support DHIS2 cascade training at zonal levels in December 2022.
- LFTW will conduct OV MDA in December 2022.
- FHF will conduct trachoma surveys refresher training in November/December 2022.

- RTI and FHF will review results of DSA Investigations desk reviews in 50 districts in November 2022.
- RTI has planned to work with MOH NTD and Resource & Partnership teams to initiate preparatory

Security Update:

The political situation in Haiti and especially Port au Prince remains chaotic and unpredictable. Acts of violence including kidnappings and killings have increased over the past few weeks. Travel within the country is almost impossible due to scarcity of fuel but also because of the establishment of gangs in various parts of the metropolitan area and some provincial cities. Schools remain closed and hospitals are running at low capacity due to the fuel shortage or simply close their doors. The recent cholera outbreak adds an extra element of pathos, as it is largely spreading through low-income areas controlled by gangs. The Act | East team are mainly working from home and field activities are suspended until the security situation improves.

Highlights:

- Act | East team finalized data cleaning and analysis for the CES completed in Acul du Nord, Milot, and Port-de-Paix in September. Results will be presented virtually to the MSPP for FY23 MDA planning.
- Act | East Haiti's MERLA Specialist attended the ASTMH conference in Seattle, Washington to share Haiti's experiences on Electronic Data Collection.
- The in-country GESI consultant shared the report and the lessons learned from the national-level GESI workshop.

 Task Force have continued to improve the functionality of the Survey Sample Builder (SSB) as well as
 incorporated lessons learned from the previous survey into final preparations for the next BIS survey
 to be implemented during November 2022.

- Act | East Nepal worked with FAIRMED Nepal to discuss proposed social mobilization activities targeting FY23 LF MDA and develop a FAA package for submission to USAID in November 2022.
- Act | East Nepal Program Manager [Redacted] presented "Efforts in addressing persistent transmission of LF: Experiences from Nepal" through the virtual platform of the COR-NTD 2022 conference on October 5th.
- Act | East Nepal met with MoHP/EDCD officials and discussed the implementation schedule of Act |
 East FY23 planned activities and selection of new sites for upcoming Re-Pre-TAS in Jhapa, Parbat,
 Bara and Baglung districts.

Highlights:

RTI

- LF TAS-2 Planning Meeting: On October 4-5, Act | East provided the financial and technical support for the Federal Ministry of Health (FMOH) and CRS State NTD team to conduct a 2-day planning meeting for LF TAS-2 to be implemented in four Evaluation Units (EUs) comprising of seven (7) LGAs (Abi, Akamkpa, Biase, Boki, Ikom, Obubra and Ogoja) of Cross River State. The meeting included the LGA NTD Coordinators of each LGA and representatives of the State Ministry of Health (SMOH), State Ministry of Education (SMOE), State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB), National Association of Proprietors of Private Schools (NAPPS) and the FMOH. The outcome was a draft survey protocol; joint plan that includes a sensitization and mobilization strategy for the selected schools; timeline for the entire survey; and field team composition per EU. Implementation of the TAS-2 is contingent on arrival of FTS kits which are expected in-country by end of November 2022.
- South-South and South-East Zonal Review Meetings: On October 6-12, Act | East provided the financial support for the FMOH to conduct NTD Review meetings for states under the South-South and South-East zonal offices. All six (6) states in the South-South and five (5) states in the South-East participated in the review meetings held. Participants discussed key NTD program issues and

finalized 2021 treatment reports. Action items from the meeting include: improve MMDP reporting; gather and report IDM data in subsequent review meetings; state programs and partners to facilitate the inauguration of Technical Advisory Committees (TAC) to enhance advocacy and mobilization of domestic resources; each state to collaboratively develop 2023 NTD annual Plan with supporting partners and share with FMOH; state NTD teams to ensure effective reverse logistics and timely submission of medicine inventory, treatment data and technical reports. Both RTI and TCC staff participated in these meetings.

Table is updated with planned FY23 activities.

Highlights:

- With technical support from Act | East consultant [Redacted], the DOH completed **TAS1 training** in Zamboanga del Norte province from October 3-5. The province began the survey in late October, upon the arrival of FTS.
- Year 1 IDA planning was completed in Oriental Mindoro province, also with technical support from Act | East consultant [Redacted], and the provincial teams are ready to begin focal drug distribution as soon as ivermectin (IVM) arrives. All IVM is currently in the DOH office in Manila awaiting a final certification of product registration, which WHO is facilitating, before being moved to Oriental Mindoro and Sultan Kudarat provinces for Year 1 of IDA.
- The development of a **Philippine Multi-Disease Elimination Plan (MDEP) for 2023-2030** continues to evolve, with external partner support from USAID via Act | East from the LF perspective and Pilipinas Shell and Global Fund from the malaria side. The plan will include up to 15 diseases that are targeted for elimination; the final list of diseases to be included is still being determined. An Act | East supported writeshop to support the drafting of the MDEP is now scheduled for January 2023.
- [Redacted], will transition into the role of MERLA focal point for the SPIN portfolio, replacing [Redacted].

Group's (RDRG) comments within their LF elimination dossier. The dossier should be resubmitted to
WHO WPRO and the RDRG in November 2022.

Viet Nam

- FHF Viet Nam worked with VNEH to select dates for upcoming trachoma surveillance surveys in December 2022. The surveys will be supported by Act | East with additional technical assistance from Tropical Data.
- VNEH confirmed that they will be required to submit a project extension request to the MOH to be able to implement four TT-only surveys that will be required for completion of the trachoma elimination dossier. This will push back the anticipated timeline for submission of the final dossier to WHO. FHF Viet Nam and Act | East HQ are working to support VNEH with this administrative process



and to identify key advocacy measures that may help hasten the MOH's approval of the extension request.

Highlights:

- WI-HER and RTI collaborated with NTDCP to conduct a GESI Pause and Reflect (P&R) meeting in Arusha from October 17-19, 2022. The meeting brought together the six councils (Ulanga DC, Mlimba DC, Longido DC, Monduli DC, Simanjiro DC and Kiteto DC) where the GESI behavior change activity was implemented in FY22 to document lessons learned and plan for GESI implementation in FY23. The meeting highlighted the importance of health education in addressing barriers to MDA uptake and involving government and traditional community leaders in MDA. Participants also discussed how to integrate GESI lessons learned into the CDD training package and potential activities for CCHPs.
- Act | East supported the NTDCP to conduct a preparation meeting for the upcoming CCHP Pause
 and Reflect meeting in November. The preparation meeting was conducted in Singida from October
 21-23, 2022. The technical team involved officers from PORALG, Directorate of Policy and Planning
 (DPP) office of the MOH, R4D, and WI-HER who collaboratively reviewed the meeting agenda,
 presentations, and documentation tools. During this preparation meeting, NTDCP and PORALG
 strongly recommended a high-level advocacy following the CCHP P&R meeting. This will be
 important for more resource mobilization at national and sub-national levels.

Upcoming activities requiring COVID protocols:

- Act | East will collaborate with NTDCP, DPP office of the MOH, and PORALG to conduct the CCHP P&R
 meeting from November 15-18 in Dodoma. The meeting will bring together district NTD coordinators
 and health secretaries from the 15 districts that implemented the CCHP activity in FY22 to gather
 feedback on the CCHP process, successes, challenges and way forward.
- In collaboration with NTDCP and PORALG, Act | East will organize review and planning meetings for the districts and regions conducting trachoma and OV MDAs in FY23. The activity will be conducted in Morogoro from November 7-10, 2022 and will be followed by the training of trainers for trachoma and OV MDAs on November 11th.
- Act | East will support the NTDCP to conduct SCH and STH MDA in 41 districts in November 2022. This MDA was postponed from FY22 Q4.
- In collaboration with NTDCP, Act | East will conduct an LF disease-specific assessment (DSA) outcome investigation in Pangani DC and Kilwa DC in November.
- Act | East Tanzania MERLA staff will attend the NTD Information System (NIS) training in Mozambique from November 28 December 3rd.
- Act | East will support NTDCP and the National Institute for Medical Research (NIMR) Tanga lab to conduct analysis of Dried Blood Spot (DBS) samples collected in FY22 for OV using OV16 rapid diagnostic tests.

Ebola Update:

On 15 September, an index case of Ebola virus disease (EVD) was identified in Mubende District, Uganda. The Ministry of Health declared an outbreak of Sudan EVD on 20 September. As of 6 November, 135 cases have been confirmed throughout 7 districts. The CoP has weekly update meetings with HQ and HO and is actively monitoring the situation. We are developing SOPs and monitoring closely how the virus evolves within Uganda to be ready to change plans should Ebola be confirmed in our implementing districts.

Highlights:

RTI

Cross border Joint MDA Review Meeting. Act | East supported the RTI team to attend the Joint MDA review meeting in Kisumu, Kenya from 26–27 October. The objective of the meeting was to review progress and document learnings and gains from the previous joint MDA and to disseminate the MDA results. The meeting was attended by Senior MOH officials from both



countries, district officials from border districts, Secretary for Health West Pokot County and partners. Some of the key recommendations were (1) to delay trachoma impact survey in West Pokot for 1 more round of MDA to have a joint impact survey with Uganda to realize intended outcomes; (2) Kenya adopting house to house approach of MDA implementation with VHTs; and (3) improving partner communication and coordination for proper planning and implementation of joint activities.

- Reverse logistics in Buliisa. Act | East supported MOH to complete reverse logistics in Buliisa district. The medicine balances were delivered to Hoima Regional Referral Hospital where they will be kept for the next round of MDA.
- Meeting with MOH team. Act | East team held a meeting with senior leadership of MOH NTDCP led by Assistant Commissioner NTDs at Vector Control Division on 20 October 2022 to discuss ways/strategies on how to successfully implement FY23 activities. Some of the key action points were to conduct quarterly review performance meetings with MOH to assess progress of implementation of activities and ensuring that NTD technical advisory committee is well constituted to guide NTD programs.
- Program Review Meeting. Act | East conducted an internal review meeting of FY22 activities to discuss the challenges and successes achieved in FY22 on 24 October 2022. Action points/recommendations were made during the meeting to support implementation of FY23 activities. A focus on making sure procurement is being more aligned with the program team was discussed and a tentative timeline was drawn up.
- CoP attended the celebration of Elimination of Sleeping Sickness in Uganda along with the MOH, partners and other high level government officials.
- RTI's Program Manager and MERLA Manager gave virtual presentations at ASTMH:
 - Experience from Joint Mass Drug Administration for Trachoma targeting migrant populations in Uganda and Kenya [Redacted]
 - Using qualitative methods to establish factors contributing to trachoma recrudescence and low mass drug administration (MDA) coverage in Amudat district [Redacted]
 - Improving Trachoma Mass Drug Administration (MDA) in pastoralists and mobile population in Moroto district Lessons learnt from a Data Quality Assessment (DQA) [Redacted]

WI-HER

- WI-HER shared Act | East's GESI behavior change work in Uganda, particularly using assessments to inform actions, at the 2022 COR-NTD Meeting. Following the presentation, the team facilitated a 30-minute breakout session of practical skill-building exercises, where participants were able to learn and apply the root cause analysis process to specific case examples provided.
- Preparations for the GESI behavior change activity for FY23 has been initiated with the engagement of the NTD focal persons in Moroto and Nabilatuk to review the FY22 MDA data to identify potential geographical locations for scaling the activity.

TCC

 MDA has been completed in 8 out of 11 districts - Kitgum, Lira, Oyam, Gulu, Omoro, Pader, Lamwo, and Nwoya. The teams are currently compiling treatment data from the community registers.

Save the Children

 Broadcasting of radio spot messages on F&E for pastoralist communities. StC broadcast 66 spot messages (2 times per day) on the F&E component in the Ng'akarimojong language from October



- 16–27, 2022 on Ateker FM in Moroto district and Heritage FM in Nabilatuk district with the aim of encouraging facial hygiene and environmental improvements in the pastoralist communities of the Karamoja sub region.
- Community dialogues. Save the Children conducted 20 community dialogues between October 17 21 in Moroto, Amudat, and Nabilatuk. The dialogues were attended by 891 participants and the aim was to create awareness of the importance of facial cleanliness and clean environments as a means to control the spread of trachoma. In Moroto district, health workers from Tapac HC III offered outreach services including Vitamin A supplementation, deworming, and vaccination of children under 4 years in five villages alongside the community dialogues.
- Budget conferences. Save the Children participated in the Amudat district and Loroo sub-county budget conferences. The meeting, which was called by the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO), was an opportunity for implementing partners to share their FY 22/23 budgets and workplans for integration into the district and sub-county annual workplans. StC availed the Memorandum of Understanding and activity reports to CAO's office which will be reviewed, and feedback given on the implementation of project interventions.

Upcoming activities requiring COVID-19 protocols:

RTI

- Pre-MDA Activities. Act | East will support MOH to conduct pre-MDA activities in preparation for December trachoma MDA in Moroto and Nabilatuk. These will be microplanning, training of district trainers, training of subcounty supervisors and health workers, training of parish supervisors and teachers, training of community medicine distributors and registration of communities for MDA. These activities are scheduled from 21 30 November 2022.
- Social mobilization of communities for MDA. Act | East will also support MOH and districts to conduct social mobilization of communities to improve MDA uptake. This will be done prior to and during MDA. Different approaches involving usage of IEC materials, radio talk shows, messages and jingles, mobile vans and megaphones will be used to educate the communities about the disease, benefits of taking the medicines and timing of the MDA. These activities are scheduled to start from 23 November 2022.

WI-HER

- Introducing behaviour change activity in Buliisa and Nakapiripirit districts. Act | East will support WI-HER and MOH introduce the GESI BC activity to key stakeholders in quarter one of FY23 in the two districts to help with buy-in and scheduling of the activity setup tasks, that will be implemented in quarter two of FY23. The meeting is scheduled to take place on 23 November 2022
- Scaling up GESI Behavior Change Activity in Moroto and Nabilatuk districts. Act | East will support WI-HER and districts to scale up GESI BC in the two districts ahead of the semi-annual MDA scheduled for December 2022. The activities are scheduled to take place from 31 October to 11 November 2022.

Community Dialogues. In November 2022, 15 community dialogues will be conducted in the pastoral communities to gather challenges to the attainment of clean households and factors leading to the spread of trachoma. The community dialogues will target community members, elders, and opinion leaders in selected villages. Follow up will be done on previous agreed action points.



- Supporting the functionality of the village sanitation committees, with the aim of supporting them to understand their roles, schedule monthly meetings, identify barriers to ideal WASH practices, and come up with small, doable actions at the village level.
- Supporting the functionality of the village sanitation committees, with the aim of reviewing the
 progress made in implementation, identifying barriers to ideal WASH practices, and identifying
 small, doable solutions at the village level.
- **Broadcasting of spot messages.** This activity will continue in the month of November 2022 to sensitize communities on measures to control and eliminate trachoma. Additionally, radio spot messages in Swahili and the Pokot languages will be produced, pre-tested, and aired on Kalya FM, which is the most listened to radio station in Amudat.

Security Update:

The economic and political situation has remained the same during the month of November. Massacres, kidnappings, and killings continue in the metropolitan area and some provincial cities. We note the availability of fuel in the Port au Prince since the police were able to regain control of the fuel terminals from the gangs. This has led to improved movement and availability of some critical goods and services. A few schools have resumed activities. The RTI office remains closed with Act | East staff working remotely from their homes. All field activities continue to be suspended until the security situation significantly improves.

Highlights:

- The FY23 Haiti work plan was approved by USAID following an amendment to the new MDA enrollers strategy at posts; this new strategy will be piloted in 4 communes during FY23 LF MDA in the North.
- In coordination with MSPP, LF implementing partners organized a virtual follow-up meeting on the LF elimination dossier. During the meeting, participants established the objectives, roles, and responsibilities of the dossier committee and created a plan to collate all LF historical data by the end of January. A data compilation sub-committee comprised of MSPP and partner M&E staff are working to compile the historical data and holding regular working meetings virtually.

- All field activities are currently suspended until the security situation improves.

• School-based SCH/STH MDA was conducted in 35 districts and STH MDA was conducted in 6 districts in November 2022, as initially planned in the FY22 work plan.

Highlights:

 Act | East supported the NTDCP to conduct regional review and planning meetings for OV and trachoma in Morogoro from November 6-12th, 2022. These involved a series of meetings that included

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review of FY22 activities, planning and budgeting for FY23 activities, and training of trainers for trachoma and OV MDAs. Participants included the NTD Coordinators for health, NTD Coordinators for education, pharmacists and accountants from 9 councils and 4 regions endemic for trachoma and 25 councils and 7 regions endemic for OV.

- Following the review and planning meetings, WI-HER supported an additional two-day GESI training in the five councils that will implement the GESI behavior change activity in FY23. In addition, Act | East presented the draft CDD training package addendum and solicited feedback on the addendum from the council and regional NTD teams. An updated version of the CDD training addendum that includes participants' feedback will be shared with national NTDCP for finalization.
- Act | East supported preparation for the CCHP Pause & Reflect meeting which was planned for November 15-18th, but the meeting had to be postponed when key PORALG facilitators could no longer participate due to competing priorities. The meeting will be rescheduled tentatively the third week of January 2023.
- Two Act | East Tanzania MERLA staff attended the NTD Information System (NIS) training in Mozambique from November 28 December 3rd.

- Pause and Reflect Session. Act | East Uganda team participated in a two-day, internal pause and reflect session about the Karamoja MDA Strategy from 7th 8th November 2022. It was attended by Save the Children, WI-HER, and RTI and the Ugandan team shared their experiences about activities that have been implemented to improve MDA outcomes among the migratory populations. Through this, some activities were identified to help enhance the treatment strategy in the upcoming MDA and the consequent MDAs.
- Meeting with Act | East Partners. RTI Act | East Uganda team held a meeting on 9th November 2022 to plan for the bi-annual MDA in Moroto and Nabilatuk districts. The partners that attended the meeting are WI-HER and Save the Children. One of the key outcomes of the meeting was to have regular review and update meetings to coordinate better as we implement MDA activities.
- Preparatory Meeting for Confirmatory mapping in Kween and Bulambuli Districts. Act | East team held a meeting on 23rd November with the Act | East Trachoma Advisor to prepare for



- confirmatory mapping scheduled to be held in February 2023 in the two districts of Kween and Bulambuli.
- Preparatory Meeting for TSS+. Act | East team held a meeting with senior RTI HQ team to plan and prepare for TSS+ scheduled to take place in July 2023 in the two EUs of Nebbi. Training component for swab collection and capacity of the local laboratories to conduct sample processing and testing were some of the issues discussed during the meeting that was held on 28th November 2022.

WI-HER

- WI-HER held a coordination meeting with Save the Children to agree on areas of coordination in FY23.
 The coordination will involve overlapping in three villages across Moroto and Nabilatuk districts and information sharing on barriers and influencers of MDA.
- Eight new villages in Moroto and Nabilatuk Districts were selected for scaling up the GESI behavior change activity. The new villages were selected on the basis of having low MDA coverage.
- The GESI behavior change activity started in all new villages following orientation of the root agents
 on tools and conducting root-cause analysis to inform behavior change team formation and devising
 of solutions to test.
- Act | East supported Moroto and Nabilatuk district GESI teams to conduct check-in meetings with
 root agents and behavior change teams in three sub-counties with both old and new villages where
 the GESI behavior change activity is being scaled up. The purpose was to monitor progress of the new
 influencers regarding testing of their solutions and to give them a chance to interact with and learn
 from the old influencers' experiences.

• Attending the Pause and Reflection meeting: Save the Children participated in the Uganda Act | East Pause and Reflection virtual meeting organized by RTI through in November. The aim of this reflection was to share experiences on progress, what is working, what is not working and come up with innovative ideas of how to move forward. During this meeting synergies were identified to ensure villages that had poor performance in previous MDA are identified especially for Moroto and Nabilatuk districts and gaps bridged for improved performance in the upcoming mass drug administration.

Summary and explanation of changes made to table above since last month: None

Security Update:

In the month of December 2022, violence and political instability remained widespread in Haiti. The epicenter of this insecurity is in the capital of Port au Prince and the West Department, where gang attacks and kidnappings remain common. Nationwide, there were continued fuel and electricity shortages, a deepening political deadlock, and a persistent cholera outbreak. Unfortunately, the hoped-for external military intervention has not taken place, and the Haitian government is slow to reach a consensus that would put an end to the ongoing crisis. Amidst all these uncertainties and difficulties, schools have kept their doors open.

The RTI office remained closed throughout December with Act | East staff working remotely from their homes. All field activities are currently on hold, but a contingency plan was drafted that would allow the project to begin activities in early February, starting with the planned pre-TAS.

Highlights:

Act | East staff held a meeting to devise a realistic and feasible plan to carry out activities despite the
security situation occurring mostly in the metropolitan region. This contingency plan relies in part on
using more local staff and vendors to undertake some tasks and travel by air to the communes to
avoid the dangers of the national roads out of Port au Prince.



- RTI initiated discussion with the MSPP on plans for World NTD Day considering the security situation. Two virtual meetings were held in December to discuss various options and the MSPP will share a final TOR and budget for proposed World NTD Day activities in early January.
- The LF elimination dossier data committee (comprised of MSPP and partner M&E staff) held their monthly virtual meeting in December. The committee is compiling historical data and progressing toward their objective of having a complete historical LF dataset by end of January.
- Act | East submitted a report of activities for FY22 to the MSPP and USAID Mission upon request.

Upcoming activities requiring COVID protocols:

- Training for pre-TAS in 2 districts (4 EUs) is planned for the last week of January.
- Celebration of World NTD Day will take place on January 30th.
- RTI and WI-HER will support the MSPP to hold a virtual annual partners' meeting and MDA training curriculum workshop in February.

- Act | East Indonesia, with the MOH, supported the implementation of a Brugia Impact Survey (BIS)
 in Konawe District. Data collection took place from November 30- December 9, 2022, with a passing
 result. A total of 1091 samples were collected and only one tested positive for Mf.

• Surveys were completed in nine districts in December 2022. TAS3 in eight districts (Okheldhunga, Kaski, Argakhachi, Pyuthan, Rolpa, Rukum East, Rukum West, Salyan) and Re-pre-TAS in one district (Bara). Results are forthcoming in the January 2023 TAS tracker submission.

Highlights:

- Madhesh Province Public Health Laboratory (MPPHL) completed field work of Re-Pre-TAS in Bara district. This was the first time Act| East Nepal implemented a FAA with a provincial level government unit in the current federal system. This model differs from working with VBDRTC in a way that, in this model all enumerators (lab technicians and counsellors) are from the government system. This aims to strengthen DSA capacity at provincial and district level for long-term sustainability. Act| East Nepal provided strong technical and some administrative support to MPPHL for this survey and believe that the provincial lab learned enough to be able to implement future DSAs with less support.

 Committee (NOEC) Meeting held in Abuja from 7th to 9th December 2022. Key highlights of the meeting include:

- LF DSA outcome investigation was conducted in Kilwa DC and Pangani DC.
- Trachoma baseline confirmatory mapping was completed in 11 districts (10 EUs).



Highlights:

- In collaboration with NTDCP, Act | East conducted trachoma confirmatory mapping surveys in 11 district councils, representing 10 EUs (Maswa DC, Mlele DC, Mpimbwe DC, Tanganyika/Mpanda DC, Momba DC, Mbozi DC, Mbeya DC, Ludewa DC, Mlimba DC, Ulanga DC, and Malinyi DC). The field data collection was preceded by a two-day training for graders and recorders on November 21–22nd. Fieldwork commenced on November 23rd and was completed on December 16th.
- In collaboration with NTDCP, Act | East conducted LF DSA outcome investigation in Pangani DC and Kilwa DC in December 2022. The activity was conducted among fishing communities and surrounding villages and involved qualitative and quantitative data collection methods. Results will inform adaptations for the next LF MDA planned in August 2023.
- Act | East supported NTDCP to conduct advocacy meetings and community sensitization in Longido DC and Ngorongoro DC for trachoma and Njombe TC for OV from December 11 18th. 2022. The community sensitization was conducted at select villages within each district, whereby local authorities highlighted the importance of MDA participation.
- With support from WI-HER, the Tanzania team developed detailed plans for the pre- and post-MDA
 GESI behavior change activity in Mlimba DC and Ulanga DC ahead of OV MDA in February. This
 included enhancing the data collection tools and producing a coaching guide. The WI-HER team, in
 collaboration with RTI and NTDCP, also continued to refine the CDD training curriculum addendum.
- On December 5th and 7th, the Act | East Tanzania leadership team including the HSS Advisor held an
 advocacy meeting with PORALG where FY23 Act | East activities were presented with a focus on how
 to strengthen collaboration. The Director of Health and Nutrition Services, PORALG, emphasized the

Ebola Update:

• MOH declared Uganda Ebola free on January 11, 2023. Prior to the announcement there were no new Ebola cases in Uganda for 42 days.

Highlights:

RTI

- Review of the NTD Master Plan (2023 to 2027): The MOH, with technical and financial support from World Health Organization (WHO), organized a three-day workshop to finalize the NTD Master Plan. Act | East was represented through RTI, WIHER and R4D. There are plans to launch the new Master Plan on World NTD Day at the end of January.
- **Delivery of drugs to the districts:** Medicines were successfully delivered to the districts of Moroto and Nabilatuk for the upcoming trachoma MDA in January.
- FAA meeting with Amudat district team: The team from RTI held a meeting with the Administrative and Technical team of Amudat district to explain the FAA package to the district and agree on timelines. Pre-MDA activities (trainings and social mobilisation) will be scheduled to start in the first week of April 2023 upon FAA approval.



• MDA preparatory meetings: The Programs and MERLA teams have met with Finance and Procurement to plan for the upcoming MDA. Presentations for training at various levels and for the microplanning meetings were prepared. Tools and other related materials have been prepared and ready to be delivered to the districts. Teams from MoH and RTI that will support the exercise have been identified.

WI-HER

- Held check-in meetings with the trained influencer teams in the 16 new villages selected for the GESI behavior change activity in Moroto and Nabilatuk Districts. WI-HER facilitated the influencers' development of action plans to increase MDA uptake ahead of the upcoming MDA.
- Met with Amudat District leadership and health center in-charge personnel to set up Act | East's continued engagement on behavior change ahead of Amudat's MDA later in the year.
- Continued coordination with StC on the integration of key barriers to MDA uptake into StC's community dialogues in our three overlapping villages

TCC

- Treatment in refugee settlements: MDA was carried out in 2 refugee camps; Palorinya in Obongi districts and Palabek in Lamwo district.
- **Entomological assessments:** A total of 4,416 *S.damnosum* flies were caught from Moyo, Nwoya, Amuru, Adjumani, Gulu, Omoro, Pader, Kitgum, Lamwo, and, Kasese districts.
- Training of Health Workers/Sub County Focal Persons and Parish Supervisors is ongoing in the 12 districts.
- Regional planning meeting: This was held from 19th-20th December 2023 in Gulu City. The main objective of this meeting was to develop district work plans and budgets for FY 2023/24. Districts specific work plans and budgets were developed and presented. For some districts, new administrative units were created, which will contribute to increased budgets.

Save the Children

- Community dialogues: StC conducted 8 community dialogues from 1st to 5th December 2022 in Nabilatuk and Moroto districts. Village Health Teams mobilized these meetings with the aim of increasing awareness on the importance of the F&E components of SAFE strategy to control the spread of trachoma. Communities identified some of the key issues for low uptake of MDA.
- Supporting the functionality of the Village Sanitation Committees (VSCs): StC conducted ten review meetings with VSCs of Moroto and Nabilatuk districts from 1st to 22nd December 2022. Committee members were reminded of their roles in their villages, and progress of implementation of activities was discussed. A total of 86 members attended the meetings.
- Broadcast of radio spot messages: The program aired 45 radio spot messages from the 8th to 15th December 2022, with messages reaching Moroto, Nabilatuk, and Nakapiripirit districts. This is aimed at increasing awareness through the health promotion messages on facial cleanliness and environmental improvement among targeted communities to influence behavioral change.
- Community feedback mechanism: StC-Act | East conducted community feedback sessions on 12th to 16th December 2022 in the districts of Amudat, Nabilatuk and Nakapiripirit. The issues highlighted in all three districts included: inconsistent communication during the MDA period affecting mobilization of the communities and not involving facilitators during follow up of actions. Recommendations were made that will guide the project team to follow up to bridge the gaps for better performance.



- Coordination with District stakeholders: The program participated in four coordination meetings with the aim of increasing visibility of the project interventions, advocating for issues identified through the different approaches, gaining ownership from the different leaders of the districts, and ensuring coordination with and leveraging of other projects in intervention areas. The meetings attended included Amudat District Health Sector Review Meeting, Save the Children Eastern Region Managers' reflection meeting, Leave No One Behind Education Project's Regional Reflection, and the teachers' training to advocate for NTD interventions in schools.
- Finalization of NTD master plan 2023-2027: StC participated in the development of the NTD Master Plan 2023-2027 from 5th to 7th December 2022. The Health System Strengthening Specialist from the StC country office provided technical support on the overall document, with a focus on trachoma and social behavioral change, and use of data for informed decision-making.
- Collaboration with WI-HER on GESI: StC- Act | East engaged the Gender Advisor –WI-HER in a community dialogue in Lokemer kapel on 1st December 2022, where barriers to MDA were discussed.

Upcoming activities requiring COVID-19 protocols:

- Commemoration of World NTD Day (to be held in Kampala 31st January)
- District Microplanning and targeted microplanning with pastoralist and mobile communities.
- Pre-MDA activities including social mobilization, sensitization of local government and community leaders, training of district trainers, subcounty supervisors/health workers, parish supervisors, CMDs and chairpersons.
- Distribution of medicines and other community logistics
- settlements

TCC

- Training of Community Supervisors and LCI leaders.
- Health education and CDD selection.
- Fresh community registration and/or register update.

StC

- StC-Act | East will provide support to twelve VSCs to conduct meetings at the village level.
- Broadcasting of spot messages will continue in communities for the upcoming MDA scheduled for January 2023.
- Community dialogues continue to be prioritized targeting kraal leaders, natural leaders and household heads in Nabilatuk, Moroto, Amudat and Nakapiripirit districts in January 2023.
- Radio talk shows will be conducted to increase awareness and participation for MDA activities.
