INTRODUCTION

This monthly progress report, number (no.) 29-August 2022, is submitted for the Architect-Engineer Independent Quality Assurance and Milestone Certification Services for USAID's Federally Administered Tribal Areas Infrastructure Program and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Reconstruction Program (A-E FIP KPRP) task order, hereinafter referred to as the Project, under United States Agency for International Development (USAID)/Pakistan's Architect-Engineer (A-E) Services Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity contract. The task order is being executed by CDM International Inc. (CDM Smith) and its subcontractors, National Development Consultants (Pvt.) Ltd. (NDC) and UNICON Consulting Services (Pvt.) Ltd. (UNICON).

PURPOSE OF THE MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT

Several ongoing and active construction contracts under various project implementation letters (PILs) are in progress. CDM Smith's team, comprising the Chief of Party/Project Manager, quality assurance (QA) specialists, engineers, inspectors, and other technical and support staff are mobilized for performing the required tasks under this task order to provide independent quality assurance (IQA) and milestone certification services (MCS). This monthly progress report also provides an update on the mobilization of staff to perform the required tasks.

SUMMARY OF FIP AND KPRP

USAID is partnering with the Government of Pakistan (GOP) to rebuild essential services damaged by natural and human-made disasters over the past decades in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and the Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA). The programs are being implemented by different GOP divisions. Through the FATA Infrastructure Program (FIP) and KP Reconstruction Program (KPRP), USAID is committed to supporting Pakistan's journey to self-reliance by strengthening its delivery of improved infrastructure to rebuild damaged essential services in KP and FATA. This government-togovernment initiative is an ambitious 200 million United States dollar (USD) activity that empowers the GOP to improve infrastructure (e.g., roads, bridges, educational facilities, health facilities, administrative buildings, drinking water supply, power transmission lines, grid stations, and solarization of tube wells [TWs]) through Project Management Units (PMUs).

FIP: Along with the GOP, USAID signed the activity agreement for the program on March 10, 2011, which was subsequently revised and amended for changes in scope, obligation of budget, and extension of the completion date. The FIP is implemented under a governmentto-government mechanism through a PMU established by the GOP under the FATA Secretariat. The PMU is headed by a Project Director (PD), has an established office in Peshawar, and is accountable to the Program Steering Committee (a governing body), which is headed by the Additional Chief Secretary, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (GoKP) Planning and Development Department.

Under the activity agreement, USAID is providing approximately 100 million USD directly to the PMU-FIP to fund the A-E services, construction contracts, and equipment and machinery procurement.

The list of activities includes construction of roads, bridges, education facilities, health facilities, drinking water supply, power transmission lines, grid stations, and solarization of TWs. Some FIP activities are complete and other activities are underway. A list of all infrastructure and construction activities monitored by CDM Smith under FIP are detailed in Annex E. The progress percentage for each individual site in Annex E is calculated using a predefined progress measurement scale attached to this report as **Annex B**.

KPRP: KPRP is implemented by the GoKP's Provincial Reconstruction, Rehabilitation, and Settlement Authority (PaRRSA). The activity agreement for the program was signed with the GoKP on June 10, 2011 and was subsequently revised and amended for changes in scope, obligation of budget, and extension of the completion date. KPRP is implemented under a government-to-government mechanism through a PMU established by the GoKP under PaRRSA, and the PMU is headed by a PD. The PMU has an established office in Peshawar and is accountable to the Program Steering Committee (a governing body), which is headed by the Director General PaRRSA.

Under the activity agreement, USAID is providing approximately 100 million USD directly to the PMU-KPRP to fund the A-E services, construction contracts, and equipment and machinery procurement.

The list of activities includes construction of roads, education facilities, health facilities, administrative GoKP buildings, and drinking water supply schemes (DWSSs). KPRP has completed some activities and other activities are underway. A list of all infrastructure and construction projects monitored by CDM Smith under KPRP are detailed in Annex C. The progress percentage for each individual site in Annex C is calculated using a predefined progress measurement scale attached to this report as **Annex B**.

1.3 A-E FIP KPRP - PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The task order seeks mainly IQA and MCS services to be provided by CDM Smith over the period of performance of the task order. The following A-E services are being provided, as required through USAID:

- a. Verify new construction sites, review assessments, and site selection reports are being provided by the GOP.
- b. Review, verify, and recommend corrective steps and certify and vet the adequacy of all engineering designs and drawings being provided by the GOP.
- c. Review bills of quantities, drawings, technical specifications, and engineer's estimates prepared by the GOP and provide recommendations to USAID on their reasonableness.
- d. Verify that the payment milestones are in line with the logical construction sequence.
- e. Perform periodic inspections and materials testing at construction sites to ensure conformity to contract design, drawings, technical specifications, and other requirements. Report any potential noncompliance with specifications and drawings.
- f. Review progress reports being submitted by the GOP's implementing partners.
- g. Collect and report data on program-relevant indicators in PakInfo, USAID's online data reporting system.
- h. Undertake periodic sampling and testing of materials, develop a testing frequency log, and report failed tests to concerned parties for corrective action.
- Monitor progress of work against the approved construction schedule. Report deviations and their causes and recommend corrective actions.

- Ensure that as-built drawings are prepared, accurate, and complete. j.
- k. Prepare monthly progress reports with illustrative photos of construction activities.
- Verify and certify the payment milestone invoices to be reimbursed to the GOP.
- m. Provide support to the GOP for developing the Environmental Documentation Form (EDF) and Environmental Mitigation and Monitoring Plan (EMMP) using the standard USAID format. Reporting on environmental compliance must be an integral part of all work plans, monthly progress reports, and final reports.
- n. Report on the GOP's compliance with the branding and marking requirements of USAID.
- o. Within the ceiling price established for this task order, perform other technical assistance activities related to USAID programs in Pakistan, including Azad Jammu, Kashmir, and northern areas, on an as-needed basis.

PROJECT AT A GLANCE

The task order requires CDM Smith to submit monthly progress reports to USAID with a summary of activities and tasks undertaken during the month. USAID provided a limited notice to proceed for activities related to KPRP projects on March 2, 2020, and a notice to proceed for FIP activities on August 8, 2020.

CDM Smith assured regular visits to active sites at a frequency required by the task order during the reporting month. All field observations were documented in field visit reports (FVRs) and communicated to USAID within the stipulated time.

The worsening security situation and subsequent advisories from law enforcement and civil administration delayed the opening of FIP offices in newly merged tribal districts (NMDs) during the reporting month. Instead of waiting further, CDM Smith intended to open a full-fledged FIP office at Hangu city, bordering the NMDs Orakzai and Kurram, to improve efficiency. However, the current security situation is not considered appropriate for operating an office, even in Hangu. Projects in the Bajaur district are being handled through the Timergara office, whereas projects in the Orakzai and Kurram districts are currently being handled by locally hired technical staff supported from the Peshawar office.

The security situation remained uncertain in Kurram, Waziristan, Mohmand, Bajaur, and Swat districts of KP causing disturbances in CDM Smith's field visit plan to one road project and two school projects in Kurram, one power project in Waziristan, six DWSS and two irrigation water supply scheme (IWSS) projects in Mohmand, one DWSS project in Bajaur, and twelve school projects in the Swat district of KP. Section 9 of this report contains further details on the security situation.

This year, severe monsoon rains triggered floods of an unprecedented scale, both in terms of volume and number of affected areas. The floods caused significant human and livestock casualties and widespread damage to private homes and public infrastructure in the country. Seventeen districts in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa have been declared "calamity hit" by Government of Pakistan (GoP). Nearly 1,600 kilometers (km) of damaged and destroyed roads have been reported in KP, obstructing access to many areas across the province. Visits to project sites located in Frontier

Region (FR) Tank, Swat, and Dir Upper districts in KP could not be conducted because of flash flooding. Section 10 of this report contains further details on weather conditions.

Despite all these challenges, CDM Smith continued fulfilling the task order requirements during the month regarding IQA and MCS, except where visits were not possible because of security issues.

I.4.I KPRP

Milestone certifications totaling 466,309.42 USD were processed during the reporting month.

In the building sector, as of the end of the reporting month three project sites (Government Girls Primary School [GGPS] Khwar Kotay Qalagai, Government High School [GHS] Utror, and Government Girls High School [GGHS] No. I Mingora) under PIL 36 in Swat district have been completed. Out of 110 flood-damaged schools (PIL 28, 30, 32, and 36), a total of 75 schools have been completed (45 schools have been completed since CDM Smith mobilization). During the reporting month, construction activities remained in progress at 13 schools; however, work remained suspended at 22 schools. Construction activities remained in progress on Tehsil-Level Government Complex (PIL 29) in tehsil Kabal in Swat district. **Annex C** contains details.

In the road sector, since CDM Smith's mobilization, five road projects and one flood protection wall project were previously completed. However, Bara Durashkhela Qalla Road (I km), Swat IL-39, has been dropped from the agreed scope. USAID direction is required on an alternate proposal with appropriate PIL revision/closure.

All DWSSs are completed except DWSS Bampokha (under PIL-38, Buner district), which was announced to be dropped according to the decision of the Director General Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) PaRRSA dated March 22, 2021. Appropriate PIL revision/closure is suggested.

PIL revision is suggested for all active and inactive PILs with dropped modules/schemes for an alternate use of funds.

1.4.2 FIP

Milestone certifications totaling 1,150,746 USD were processed during the reporting month.

Out of 70 projects in the building sector, 23 projects (22 schools and 1 hospital) are being dropped as decided in the project steering committee meeting held on November 25, 2021. However, official instructions are still awaited. A total of 16 project sites were found to be gradually progressing during the reporting month. Construction activities were stopped at 31 schools because of financial/other issues between the executing department and contractors.

Out of six roads, construction activities were stopped on Murghan to Nikka Ziarat Road and Asil Targhawo Road during the reporting period. At the end of the reporting month, Loesam Nawa Pass Road in Bajaur attained 93 percent completion, Asil Targhawo Road in Bajaur attained 86 percent completion, Ghiljo to Dabori Road in Orakzai attained 75 percent completion, Jamrud Bypass Road in Khyber attained 62 percent completion, Bara to Mastak Road in Khyber attained 45 percent completion, and Murghan to Nikka Ziarat Road in Kurram attained 29 percent completion.

Out of 175 water supply schemes, 44 schemes have been dropped. There are 65 water supply schemes that have been physically completed until the end of this reporting period. Financial completion has been achieved on another 6 sites during the reporting month, bringing the total number of physically and financially completed sites to 42. Physically and financially completed

schemes are not further monitored after certification of the last milestone, and PMU-FIP is required to ensure operation and maintenance of the schemes through relevant departments. Milestone certification continued during the reporting month and several milestones were certified or denied based on findings from the site during field visits. No physical activity was observed at DWSSs during the reporting month because of severe weather conditions. One of the five power projects is physically completed, while construction activities continued to remain stopped at 132 kilovolt (kV) Grid Station landola and the remaining three continue to progress, including the power sector project for rehabilitation of damaged 11 kV feeders in South Waziristan, which could not be visited during the reporting month because of security issues. CDM Smith's request submitted to PMU-FIP and forwarded by PMU-FIP to the relevant government department for security arrangements remained pending with that department, which delayed milestone certification activities on the aforementioned project.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES PROGRAM KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA 1.4.3

Periodic site visits to the workshop under Municipal Services Program Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (MSPKP) were conducted by CDM Smith during the reporting period. Construction activities were in progress at main administration building, workshop building, electric room, and boundary wall. Annex I provide further details. Moreover, the PMU-MSPKP supervisory consultant, via a letter AiD/MSP/PESH/88 dated August 15, 2022, has requested the contractor to remove rejected thermopore from site.

Regular telephone conversations were held with the stakeholders during the reporting period. Details of meetings and teleconferences conducted with stakeholders during the reporting month are as follows.

- A virtual coordination meeting was conducted between USAID, PMU-MSPKP, Associates in Development (AiD) consultants, and CDM Smith on August 5, 2022, to discuss the slow progress of work and quality issues reported by CDM Smith.
- On August 6, 2022, a meeting was conducted between PMU-MSPKP, contractor MSPKP, AiD consultants, and CDM Smith at the MSPKP project site to discuss the delay in project completion, slow progress of work, associated hurdles/bottlenecks, and the way forward.
- On August 17, 2022, a meeting was conducted between AiD consultants, contractor MSPKP, and CDM Smith at the AiD MSPKP office in Peshawar to finalize the revised work plan and decisions regarding pending issues.

PROJECT ORGANIZATION

CDM Smith's organization chart for this task order is provided in Annex A. Table 2.1 lists the staff and mobilization dates for this task order. This table also includes the changes made to staffing through the USAID-approved budget realignment. FIP staff is being inducted gradually considering workload and mobility constraints posed by the security situation.

To increase efficiencies and provide cost savings, some staff is shared between A-E FIP KPRP and USAID's other task order.

OFFICE OPERATIONS 3.1

The Peshawar, Mingora, and Bajaur/Timergara offices are operational and are handling the KPRP and FIP workload. Since receipt of the limited notice to proceed for KPRP in March 2020 and for FIP in August 2020, CDM Smith commenced field visits for KPRP and FIP milestone certifications from the Peshawar and Mingora offices. In response to field observations during visits to FIP, advisories from various departments, and travel restrictions to and from merged districts in FIP, CDM Smith proposed a budget realignment for the task order, the approval of which was received in December 2020.

To improve efficiency, CDM Smith planned to open a full-fledged FIP office in the city of Hangu, bordering the NMDs Orakzai and Kurram. This office continues to remain on hold because of security issues. Opening an office inside the NMDs will be considered as soon as the security situation improves. Projects in the Bajaur district are being handled through the Timergara office, whereas projects in the Orakzai and Kurram districts are currently being handled by locally hired technical staff supported from the Peshawar office.

According to the original proposal and realignment, the status of each planned office follows.

- 1. **Peshawar Office:** This is the main project office and is fully operational.
- 2. Bajaur/Timergara Office: The office is fully operational.
- 3. Mingora Office: The office is fully operational.
- 4. Kurram Office: Locally hired technical staff are operating from home using locally hired vehicles. Opening the office in Kurram or a bordering district is currently on hold, considering the advisories from law enforcement and civil administration.
- 5. Orakzai Office: Locally hired technical staff are operating from home using locally hired vehicles. Opening the office in Orakzai or a bordering district is currently on hold, considering the advisories from law enforcement and civil administration.
- Dera Ismail Khan (D.I. Khan) Office: The D.I. Khan office, which was used jointly with CDM Smith's separate task order Architect-Engineer Services for Independent Third-Party Monitoring of the MSPKP, was closed on December 31, 2021.

3.2 FINANCIAL PROGRESS ON TASK ORDER




Figure 3.1: Milestone Certified Amount - FIP and KPRP




Figure 4.1: Milestone Certified Amount - KPRP




Figure 4.2: Financial Progress Graph - KPRP

4.3 STAKEHOLDER MEETINGS AND COORDINATION

Regular telephone conversations were held with the stakeholders during the reporting period. Details of meetings and teleconferences conducted with stakeholders during the reporting month are as follows:

- A progress review meeting on developmental projects under KPRP was held on August 18, 2022, between USAID, PDMA-PaRRSA, Project Unit Communication and Works (PU C&W), and CDM Smith at the CDM Smith office in Islamabad.
- A coordination meeting was conducted between PaRRSA (Mr. Amjad Khan, Deputy Director-Infrastructure) and CDM Smith on August 25, 2022, at the CDM Smith Peshawar office to discuss revisions of PIL 28, PIL 30, PIL 32, and PIL 36 under KPRP. Requests for additional work at six school project sites under PIL 36 were reviewed considering the PIL requirements, and all were found invalid considering the already set milestones. This was a follow-up meeting scheduled in continuation to the earlier meeting held with USAID and PaRRSA on August 18, 2022, in Islamabad.

4.4 **FIELD VISITS**

Field visits were conducted during the reporting month, as shown in Table 4.3. A total of 30 FVRs were submitted in the reporting month based on periodic inspections. Observations made during field visits were shared with USAID through FVRs and weekly email updates.




Figure 4.3: Monthly Field Visits (May 2020-August 2022)




Figure 4.4: KPRP Field Visit Statistics

Failed test reports are regularly analyzed, evaluated, and retested by CDM Smith. Failed test reports/results are communicated to the relevant department for necessary action.




Figure 4.5: Summary of KPRP QA Test Results




Figure 5.1: Milestone Certified Amount - FIP




Figure 5.2: Financial Progress Graph - FIP




Figure 5.3: Monthly Field Visits (August 2020–August 2022)




Figure 5.4: FIP Field Visit Statistics - Buildings




Figure 5.5: Summary of FIP Building Sector - QA Test Results




Figure 5.6: FIP Field Visit Statistics - Roads




Figure 5.7: Summary of FIP Road Sector - QA Test Results




Figure 5.8: FIP Field Visit Statistics - MEP




Figure 5.8: Summary of FIP MEP Sector - QA Test Results

GENDER REPORTING

8.1 **SUMMARY**

In August, two schools, GGPS Aman Kot and GGPS Maroba in district Nowshera, were visited. Construction activities there have been previously completed. This visit was conducted by the Gender Specialist (Deeba Shabnum) who was accompanied by a Civil Engineer (Mr. Sarfaraz).

8.2 FINDINGS AND OBSERVATIONS

GGPS AMAN KOT 8.2.1

The school building has three sections: a primary section (kindergarten to grade 5), middle section (grade 6 to grade 8), and high section (grade 9 to grade 10). Under KPRP, the primary section was constructed. Construction work has completed, and regular primary classes have started. The classrooms are enough for the students, but there is no playground. Interaction was made with the head teacher of the middle section and the head teacher of the primary section. The head teacher of the primary section knew that the school was funded by USAID.

There were in total nine classrooms and an office, and the school was overall well maintained. The students enrolled at GGPS Aman Kot travel long distances, and it takes about 3 hours per day to travel to and from the school. No washrooms are available in the primary section of this school, although provision of a lavatory block was part of the PIL's scope of work. Because of space constraints it was not constructed at the site. Students in the primary section are using washrooms in the middle section.

This is a girls' school, but it was seen that eight boys are also enrolled at this school. The reason for their enrollment is that their sisters are studying here; therefore, the parents prefer sending them with their daughters. The boundary wall is very low and according to the teachers it is against the village norms to be seen from the outside.

GGPS MAROBA 8.2.2

During the visit, interaction was made with six community women, eight children, and one teacher. It is a small triple story school having proper water facilities and a fire extinguisher. There are five classrooms, one office, and three washrooms, with one specifically for children with disabilities. There is one nonlocal teacher at this school. Currently enrolled students are 120; this was previously 150, but 30 students have dropped out from the school and have joined madrassas (religious schools) because the teacher at this school is not a local resident. She does not come to the school on regular basis. The Parent-Teacher Council (PTC) is active and has six members in total. The PTC has regular meetings and meeting minutes are properly documented.

8.8 **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

Both schools have a PTC, but they did not get involved in the designing and construction of schools. Moreover, local people were not hired as laborers during the construction phase of these schools.

RECOMMENDATIONS 8.9

- The local community should be engaged in the construction work.
- A staff room should be built in schools to assist the teachers in general and nonlocal teachers and ones with minors in particular.
- Regular attendance of the teacher should be ensured by the education department to increase enrollment.

SECURITY SITUATION

CDM Smith included a security plan and budget with the cost proposal submitted to USAID on July 22, 2019. The latest version of the security plan is implemented by the operations and security manager in coordination with the project manager. The project team has continued to work with CDM Smith's health and safety department and with International SOS (the security subcontractor) to develop the necessary security risk assessment.

The overall security situation in KP remains uncertain and challenging. Travel restrictions also kept increasing because security authorities continued conducting various operations. The security situation in KP and merged districts remains volatile and is escalating further. Table 9.1 presents incidents during this reporting month:

During the reporting period, the Chief of Party (CDM Smith) discussed the security situation with DIG Security, KP, who stated that presently, TTP has become very active in attacking security agencies and kidnapping notable or wealthy people for ransom. He shared that during the last 5 months, 85 cases of demanding ransom were reported in various police stations of KPK. Most of

them were in Peshawar and the surrounding area. He further stated that most victim families do not inform police if they are involved in this kind of situation.

The security situation remained uncertain in Kurram, South Waziristan, Mohmand, Bajaur, and Swat districts of KP, causing disturbances in CDM Smith's field visit plan to:

CDM Smith's security guards continued performing duties at the Peshawar, Timergara, and Mingora offices. CDM Smith continues to observe security developments and formulates strategies accordingly. Considering the security climate, staff from CDM Smith's offices in KP have been advised to remain vigilant and take the following actions:

- Provide security briefings to security guards regarding the latest threat alerts.
- Keep satellite offices accordingly informed.
- Do not allow visitors to enter office premises without an urgent reason, staff recognition of the visitor, and permission from the security manager.
- Brief drivers and instruct them to be vigilant during field visits.

With all the challenges created by the security/political situation, CDM Smith managed to maintain the field visit frequency and milestone certification schedule. CDM Smith carefully reviews the security circumstances and plans field visits accordingly.

10 WEATHER CONDITIONS

10.1 KPRP

The following project sites under this program were affected by the heavy rainfall and flooding during the reporting month.

A. Completed Project Sites

- I. The earlier constructed flood protection wall under KPRP IL-37 completed in January 2021 along the river Swat upstream of Ayub Bridge is severely damaged. About 780 Rft (running feet) out of a total of 2,500 Rft length of this protection wall and its embankment is completely washed away, along with other partial damages due to this massive river flood. The flood significantly overtopped this wall and flooded the entire Mingora Bypass Road and the surrounding hotels/property at various locations.
- 2. Amandara Head Works and its Additional Training (AT) Works in Chakdara (district Malakand) are affected by this high flood. A flood discharge of 245,000 cubic feet per second washed away the protection wall at different locations, with damages to the weirs and other allied facilities. Because the access road to the AT Works is washed away, and considering the high rover flow, it is difficult to reach the AT Works for damage assessment. The irrigation department is reviewing the damages once the flow of the river Swat is reduced.

B. Under-Construction Project Sites

- 1. National Highway from Swat to Kalam is significantly washed away at many locations from Bahrain to Kalam. There are four school project sites under construction in Kalam region that are being adversely affected because of route closures. Considering the approaching snowbound period, these projects are likely to get delayed until the summer season if routes are reconstructed by the government during this period.
- 2. Similarly, an access road to an under-construction school project (i.e., GPS Shomnai in Dir Upper district) has been washed away at some locations thus restraining access to the area. Further, the under-construction school site is being used as a shelter for the local affected people, and a medical camp has been established in this school by rescue workers.

10.2 FIP

The following project sites under this program were affected by the heavy rainfall and flooding during the reporting month:

I. 132 kV Transmission Line Timergara Khar, Bajaur

Tower No. 8 located inside Panjkora River was damaged because of soil erosion by high floods. It has also damaged Tower No. 7 and Tower No. 9 because of cable tension. TESCO (Tribal Electric Supply Company) has surveyed the site as requested by the subdivision Officer TESCO Bajaur. The contractor who had completed this project has been mobilized by TESCO and is expected to start working on rehabilitation work starting the first week of September 2022.

2. Asil Targhawo Road, Bajaur

Scouring/erosion of subbase shoulders had been observed at RD 8+340, RD 8+660, RD 10+715, and RD 11+100.

3. Bara to Mastak Road, Khyber

Excessive flooding resulting from torrential rains has damaged the abutment walls of the culvert at RD 31+850 and breast wall of 5-meter length from RD 37+225 to RD 37+230 on Bara to Mastak Road.

Moreover, the CDM Smith Environmental Specialist could not conduct a visit to 132 kV Transmission Line Pezu - Tank - Jandola in FR Tank planned for August 29-30, 2022 because of flooding in the area.

II CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 PANDEMIC

According to the COVID-19 data shared by the National Command and Operation Center, up until the end of the reporting month, 223,513 cases have been confirmed, 212,886 people have recovered, and 6,349 people have died across KP from COVID-19. The overall fatality rate is 2.8 percent, and the recovery rate is 95.2 percent.²






Annex A Organization Charts




Annex A.I | MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT NO. 29 – AUGUST 2022 USAID.GOV





