Strengthen the democratic trade union and composine organization movement in Honduras.

B. 1. Conditions which will exist when above purpose is achieved.

Honduran trade union movement is providing following services:

- A. Trade union enterprise program providing feasibility and marleting studies, funding, and management assistance to develop small business.
- B. North Coast labor fed. (FESITEANH) capable of managing trade union education.
- C. Compesine related programs in credit marketing and farm supply developed to assist farmers increase production.
- D. Trade union and campesino membership increased 10% by 3/31/76.
- E. New collective contracts signed.

- 2. Evidence to date of progress toward these conditions.
- A. In response to Burricane Fifi, enterprise program developed 2 projects, housing factory and hand made textiles. Two additional projects, cooperative supermittes and food preservation industry continue. All 4 will need additional management and budget assistance in FT76; basic transp. vehicle project dropped.
- B. IFES was demaged by hurricane; program curtailed in favor of priority relief activities, thus setting back federation plans to assume increasing share of wasts. Efforts in FY76 to resume normal operations.
- C. ANACH role included distributing feed in relief to 5,413 families and tools to 64 ANACH villages after Fifi. Credit extended to 2,385 ANACH families for emergency planting.
- D. New post Fifi baseline figures under development.
- E. 84 collective contracts effective in free labor movement; 16 new and renegotiated during rating period, all contain dues check-off provisions.

 V. PROGRAMMING GOAL

A. Statement of Programming Goal

Increase worker and campesino participation in the socio-economic development of the country.

B. Will the achievement of the project purpose make a significant contribution to the programming goal, given the magnitude of the national problem? Cite evidence.

Burricane Fifi adversely affected the Honduran labor union movement in various ways. It devasted farm lands where AMACH settlements were located, not only ruining crops members counted on for current income, but for paying agric. credits. The hurricane damaged also the trade union housing suburbs, training institute, and beekeeping factory; in short, the hurricane's worst damage was in the area of the strongest union additity — the Borth Coast. By responding to the emergency in a spirited and effective manner, the words unions and AMACH gained publicity and respect for their organizations. The AMACH food distributions program, trade union job employment and housing projects, and MMLF lean for credit facilities, all these and other responses to the emergency have helped turn adversity into advantage for the labor union and camposine organizations. The GOM has designated 1976 as the year of reconstruction; we look for this effort in the labor movement to re-solidify prior gains and recover to prior levels of activity so that foother progress toward increased worker participation in GOM development can occur in the
