T. COULTRY HTGHLTGHTS

Examinations for high-level administrative positions and for positions as statistical experts were held in the State Institute of Statistics in late April. These examinations, which were preceded by qualifying examinations in English-language proficiency, were open to the public. Fourteen persons, all STS employees but one, took the examinations, and of these eleven were successful: one for the position of Pepartment Head, one for that of Assistant Department Head, seven for positions of Division Chief, and two for positions as Junior Statistical Expert. Of the eleven who were successful, nine were former AID participants.

Miss Sener Güner, an ATT participant who returned in January, 1969, after a year of training in library science at the U.S. Bureau of the Census, was promoted to the position of Chief Librarian for STS. Hiss Güner succeeded Mr. Etem Unit who now heads the Pivision of Organization and Methods in the Technical Tepartment.

The fourth in a series of statistical seminars being conducted by STS for Chambers of Commerce was held in Samsun in early April. Mr. Sabahaddin Alpat, President of STS, headed the STS staff that participated. These seminars are designed to acquaint Chambers of Commerce with STS activities and to encourage and promote improvement in the quality of statistics reported to STS and in the prompt reporting of statistics.

During two weeks of April, Mr. Parr was on TDY in India to continue his advisory services to the School Lunch Fvaluation Survey.

Preparation for the 1970 Agricultural Census moved ahead as planned. Plans for test work this summer were reviewed. Special analyses were made of a 1963 village head man survey and the 1969 'rricultural Technician Survey in an effort to make better estimates of the sample size that will be required for selected items to be covered in the census: fields, vegetable area, and sheep numbers. A sampling plan is being developed to tie together information to be obtained from household interviews with that obtained from not sampling for purposes of land-area estimates, both for the census and current agricultural statistics programs.

The problem of peripheral equipment for the UNWA 9400, scheduled for delivery on June 18, was studied intensively, and to advise on the equipment to be bought, Mr. Sartwell accompanied three SIS staff members on a fact-finding trip to Germany and Switzerland where Remivac has computer installations.



I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

This project is designed to assist the Government of Turkey, State Institute of Statistics (SIS) in developing a sound and modern statistical system. A reliable system of statistical collection, compilation and evaluation is essential to Turkey's total effort in economic development.

The State Institute of Statistics, with the advice of U.S. PASA technicians from the US Bureau of Census, has planned a long-range program of expansion and improvement. The need for U.S. assistance is expected to end in 1973. Project activities are directed toward four broad goals, as follows:

- A. Improved internal coordination within the State Institute of Statistics through systematic exchange of information, and improved external coordination with other agencies of the Turkish Covernment through permanent panels or working groups in significant subject fields of statistics.
- B. Development of employee skills, especially in clerical, enumerative, tabular (and computer) programming, and supervisory jobs. Also, increasing the competence of SIS professionals through the training of key personnel in the United States.
- C. Establishment of a central automatic data processing facility in the State Institute of Statistics.
- D. Establishment or improvement; of basic economic measurements which are required to support a structure of comprehensive national accounts, including benchmark censuses, periodic reporting systems and sample surveys.

II. COURSE OF ACTION

A. Summary of Project Activities to Date

Since the beginning of this project in 1962, the State
Institute of Statistics has been established under broad and comprehensive statutory authority (Isw 53), with a staffing pattern and salary scale which has enabled it to attract and to retain qualified statisticians. Since its inception, the SIS has made rapid progress, which includes:

1) Moving into a well-designed building of its own, 2) Graduating the fourth class from its National Statistical Training Center (total graduates to date are 116), 3) Taking periodic benchmark censuses in population,

housing, agriculture, manufacturing, distributive trade and government employment as provided by law, 4) Establishing a Central Bureau of Intelligence to coordinate reporting and informational functions, 5) Developing a Master Sample of Urban Households for use in labor force, consumer expenditure and other household respondent surveys,

6) Hosting several professional conferences, seminars and workshops and helping to organize the Turkish Statistical Association.

Under delegation from the President of the State Institute of Statistics, the Ministry of Health has established an on-going statistical project called the Turkish Demographic Survey. This survey, which will continue as a permanent effort of the Ministry of Health and SIS, is the first nationwide urban and rural sampling of data on births, deaths and internal migration.

- B. In U.S. FI 1969, the State Institute of Statistics (SIS) will continue or undertake the following activities with the assistance of U.S. Advisors.
- 1. The President of the SIS will work directly with the Principal Statistical Advisor in strengthening the SIS and improving its institutional effectiveness. The prime areas for program consideration and action will be the following:
 - a. To establish an effective field headquarters organization in the SIS competent to develop instructional material and to coordinate activities in the Regional Directorate Offices.
 - b. To establish Planning and Evaluation Groups in the various departments of SIS.

- f. To improve economic series deriving from censuses, sample surveys and reporting systems, particularly in the subjects of industry, prices, distributive trade, tourism, construction, minerals and transportation.
- 2. The Chief, SIS Agricultural Statistics Division, with the assistance of the Agriculture Statistics Advisor, will continue surveys in Agricultural land Use and the Filbert Tree Count and Yield. In addition, this department will consider how to prepare the 1970 Census of Agriculture and methods for estimating livestock numbers and products. These projects have been endorsed by the President of SIS, and necessary counterpart advisors have been selected to be trained to assist in this activity.
- 3. The Director of the Statistical Training Center (STC), with the assistance of the Statistical Training Advisor, will strengthen and expand the STS training program. An academic curriculum on census techniques, now being developed, will be introduced as a special course in the Spring of 1969. - 2. Data Processing Advisor This advisor (arrived in June 1963) has been engaged in advising the SIS on the processing of data by its machine tabulation division. He is working with the chief of this division, and other SIS staff members, on plans to card punch and tabulate the 1963 Census of Agriculture and the 1963-64 Census of Establishments. In addition, he will be assisting with conducting studies and will make recommendations aimed at improving the operations of the GOT's major statistical processing entity.
- 3. Consumer-Price Statistics Advisor This advisor will work with the SIS in preparing questionnaires, forms, work sheets, and other materials and will advise on pre-test surveys as well as the actual survey operations. He will prepare suggested procedures in accordance with Turkish conditions and in consonance with definitions and concepts recommended by the U.N., I.L.O., and other recognized organizations. A major task will be the training and placement of qualified personnel in the field and the central office.
- 4. Agricultural Statistics Advisor This advisor will assist in developing procedures and preparing detailed instructions, establishing definitions and concepts; preparing processing specifications, recruiting, training; and will aid the Government in developing the required analysis and research programs associated with or comprising the Agriculture Census. Since the estimates of grain production and other agricultural commodities have tremendous implications for GOT and U.S. Government relationships, the need for developing a reliable series of current agricultural statistics has been emphasized. In this connection, the goal will be acceptance of the SIS's estimates as the official Government figure which would eliminate confusion when the various estimates are made by several different agencies.
- 5. Statistical Training Advisor A statistical training advisor is proposed to assist the SIS in the establishment and maintenance of a statistical personnel for Government agencies and for participating private sector establishments. Requests for future teaching assistance will be based on availability in Turkey of qualified foreign and national statistical experts. A total need of 17 man-years of teaching assistance is anticipated in the five-year period for which the GOT has requested technical assistance for the Center.
- 6. Population Statistics Advisor The services of a Demographer or a Specialist in Population Statistics are being requested to assist the State Institute of Statistics in carrying out demographic analysis and statistical research activities from survey data. The SIS plans to inaugurate a household survey in the 1964-65 period and this advisor will assist the organization in setting up the survey machinery as a fixed part of the nation's statistical system. Data on population, including the labor force, and other characteristics would be regularly collected. In addition, the advisor will assist the SIS in preparing for the 1965 Censuses of Population and Housing. Coordination will be carried on with the Ministry of Health's vital statistics and family planning statistics program.

- 2. Data Processing Advisor This advisor (arrived in June 1963) has been engaged in advising the SIS on the processing of data by its machine tabulation division. He is working with the chief of this division, and other SIS staff members, on plans to card punch and tabulate the 1963 Census of Agriculture and the 1963-64 Census of Establishments. In addition, he will be assisting with conducting studies and will make recommendations aimed at improving the operations of the GOT's major statistical processing entity.
- 3. Consumer Expenditure Price Statistics Advisor This advisor will complete his two-year assignment in September 1965. The consumer expenditures program of the GOT has been initiated during the tour in the following major cities: Adana, Izmir, Ankara, Istanbul and Autalya. The State Institute of Statistics plans to continue this program. There is no plan to replace the present incumhent when he complete his assignment, hence this job will be aboli, led as of November 1, 1965.
- 4. Agricultural Statistics Advisor This advisor will assist in developing procedures and preparing detailed instructions, establishing definitions and concepts; preparing processing specifications, recruiting, and training; and he will aid the Government in developing the required analysis and research programs associated with or comprising the Agriculture Census. Since the estimates of grain production and other agricultural commodities have tremendous implications for GOT and U.S. Government relationships, the need for developing a reliable series of current agricultural statistics has been emphasized. In this connection, the goal will be acceptance of the SIS's estimates as the official Government figure which would eliminate confusion when the various estimates are made by several different agencies.
- 5. Statistical Training Advisor A statistical training advisor has been recruited and is expected to report in Ankara in July 1965. The previous incumbent completed one year in this assignment and departed Ankara in February 1965. This advisor will assist the SIS in the establishment and maintenance of a statistical training center for government personnel and for private sector establishments. Requests for further teaching assistance may be expected from the SIS in accordance with the availability in Turkey of qualified foreign and national statistical experts.
- 6. Population Statistics Advisor The services of a Demographer or a Specialist in Population Statistics are being requested to assist the State Institute of Statistics in carrying out demographic analysis and statistical research activities from survey data. The SIS plans to inaugurate a household survey in the 1964-65 period and this advisor will assist the organization in setting up the survey machinery as a fixed part of the nation's statistical system. Data on population, including the labor force, and other characteristics would be regularly collected. In addition, the advisor will assist the SIS in preparing for the 1965 Censuses of Population and Housing. Coordination will be carried on with the Ministry of Health's vital statistics and family planning statistics program.

- 7. Demographic Survey Statistician The Ministry of Health and Social Welfare is carrying on for the GOT a continuing demographic survey. The survey is being conducted monthly on a sample basis throughout the nation and is expected to provide basic vital statistics data required for population estimates and for Government policy and administration, and will also obtain needed data for the family planning program which the Government is commencing. Subsequent to the organization of the survey and the compilation of the demographic data, additional services of a population statistics analyst may be required for a shorter period.

- (2) Data Processing Advisor This advisor (arrived in June 1963) has been engaged in advising the SIS on the processing of data by its machine tabulation division. He is working with the chief of this division, and other SIS members, on the card punching and tabulation of the 1966 Census. In addition, he will be assisting with conducting studies and will make recommendations aimed at improving the operations of the GOT's major statistical processing entity.
- (3) Agricultural Statistics Advisor This advisor will assist in developing procedures and preparing detailed instructions, establishing definitions and concepts; preparing processing specifications, recruiting, and training; and he will aid the Government in developing the required analysis and research programs associated with or comprising the Agriculture Census. Since the estimates of grain production and other agricultural commodities have tramendous implications for GOT and U.S. Government relationships, the need for developing a reliable series of current agricultural statistics has been emphasized. In this connection, the goal will be acceptance of the SIS's estimates as the official Government figure which would eliminate confusion when the various estimates are made by several different agencies.
- (4) Statistical Training Advisor A statistical training advisor was recruited and arrived in Ankara in August 1965. This advisor assists the SIS in the establishment and maintenance of a statistical training center for both government personnel and private sector establishments. Requests for further teaching assistance may be expected from the SIS in accordance with the availability in Turkey of qualified foreign and national statistical experts.
- (5) Demographic Survey Statistician The Ministry of Health and Social Welfare is carrying on for the GOT a continuing demographic survey. The survey is being conducted monthly on a sample basis throughout the nation and is expected to provide basic vital statistics data required for population estimates and for Government policy and administration, and will also obtain necessary data for the family planning program which the government is beginning.
- (6) Sampling Advisor This advisor will aid the State Institute of Statistics in development and use of sampling techniques for the major censuses and other surveys. He will devise mathematical techniques involved in accelerating the processing of censuses and survey schedules, and shall establish quality control procedures. He will cooperate with the objectives of the Statistical Training Center by conducting in-service training courses for SIS personnel and will conduct one or more regular courses as requested. It will be the responsibility of the Sampling Advisor to formulate many of the technical procedures employed in the GOT Statistical System.

- (7) Economic Statistics Advisor (to be recruited) This advisor will assist in the development of a revised financial statistics program. He will work with the Institute in the analysis of business and industrial statistics collected in censuses and periodic surveys. He will assist in the initiation of analysis work in other economic statistics areas such as foreign trade, prices, construction, transportation, etc.
- (8) Population Statistics Advisor (to be recruited) The services of a demographer or a population statistics advisor are being requested to assist the State Institute of Statistics in carrying out demographic analysis and statistical research tute of Statistics in carrying out demographic analysis and statistical research activities from survey data. The SIS inaugurated a household survey in 1966. This advisor will assist the SIS in setting up the survey machinery as a fixed part of the nation's statistical system. Data on population, including the labor force, and other characteristics will be regularly collected. In addition, the advisor shall assist the SIS with the continuing Censuses of Population and Housing. Coordination will be carried on with the Ministry of Health's vital statistics and family planning statistics program.

- D. If, to implement this agreement, a contract is entered into for the performance of services outside the United States by U.S. citizens, the Bureau of the Census will take appropriate action to assure compliance with the Loyalty and Related Agencies Appropriation Act of 1967 (Public Law 89-691).

- (2) Data Processing Advisor Incumbent in this position completed shortened tour in July 1967 and proceeded on loan to ECAFE. Replacement will continue advising the SIS on a broad range of processing activities with particular emphasis on better systems planning and procedural documentation and in compilation of a computer feasibility study based on Government-wide utilization of a central data processing service facility.
- Agricultural Statistics Advisor This advisor, returning for a second tour beginning September 1967, will continue current experimental surveys of land use (both area cropped and harvest yield), livestock inventories, and production surveys for specialized crops. From these will come recommendations for improved techniques and deployment of resources to improve official agricultural estimates in Turkey.
- (4) Statistical Training Advisor This advisor, beginning second tour in August 1967, will assist in strengthening the academic and in-service training capability of the State Institute of Statistics, advising the Director of its Statistical Training Center in evolutionary development of curriculum and in demonstration of pedagogical techniques. This survey is the specific measurement tool for ascertaining current level and rate of growth of the population of Turkey.
- (6) Statistical Sampling Advisor will assist in developing a long-range statistical research program in the SIS with current emphasis on alternative survey designs, development of master sample frames for household surveys and crop reporting, response research and measurement of reliability.
- Economic Statistics Advisor (to be recruited) will assist the SIS in establishment and/or improvement of basic economic measurements required to support a structure of comprehensive and integrated national accounts. He will assist in analysis of recent benchmark censuses in industry and distributive business and in planning of current surveys and reports, particularly new construction surveys, consumer expenditure studies, wholesale price reporting and labor force surveys.

- (2) Data Processing Advisor will work with the SIS on a broad range of data processing activities with particular emphasis on better systems planning and procedural documentation, compilation of a computer feasibility study and recommendation for government-wide use of a central data processing facility, computer acquisition, and training of data processing personnel.
