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INTRODUCTION

Purpose and Scope of Compendium

Family planning leaders everywhere face the challenge of meeting the growing demand for family planning services. As programs evolve and expand, the management problems are becoming increasingly complex. The Family Planning Management Training (FPMT) project is working with program managers in more than 25 countries to resolve a wide range of management problems in order to expand the availability of safe and effective family planning services. FPMT provides training and technical assistance tailored to specific organizational and individual needs in a wide variety of management areas.

The purpose of this Compendium is to identify short-term, long-term, and/or individualized training programs that can help build skills appropriate to leaders, future leaders, and managers of family planning programs in developing countries. It is designed to be useful not only to the FPMT Project but to other projects, programs, and organizations planning participant training for family planning leaders and managers. The Compendium draws from the academic areas of public health, community health, business management, public administration, preventive medicine, and health services administration. Academic and professional organizations from both the public and private sectors are included.

These listings and descriptions of programs are, of course, not exhaustive; as programs change and participant experience accumulates, there will be a need to update and add to the information. To this end, a user-friendly database has been created and will be maintained for easy reference by those planning participant training. The database will be continually updated to reflect new information.

Methodology

A six-step methodology was employed in developing the Compendium:

- 1. Directories were used to identify accredited programs in public healt health administration, public affairs and administration, and busine administration. Additional directories were used to identify Engli language training, community health, health education, and preventi medicine programs. Existing inventories such as AID's Worldwide Traini 1985, and M. Bernhart's Family Planning Management Training were also use (For complete list of directories used, see Annex A).
- 2. Requests for information were mailed to more than 500 institutions a organizations; information was also obtained from the Educational Testi Service on the GRE, GMAT, and TOEFL exams.
- 3. A database was custom-designed to accommodate the collection a reporting of the information and to facilitate the use of the information placing participants over the next several years.
- 4. Protocols (see Annex B) were designed, tested, and revised for use organizing the information received. The protocols were designed to compatible with the custom-designed database.
- 5. After information from written materials was entered in the protoco follow-up phone calls were made to elicit additional information at determine the potential for customized training or internships.
- 6. Information and narrative descriptions for each institution were entered in the database.

Assessment visits have been made to some programs that appeared to have significant potential for collaboration because they offer relevant courses have extensive international experience, display considerable flexibility: creating customized courses, and have expressed interest in furthed discussions. It is expected that more visits will be made as the screening process progresses.

Definitions and Criteria for Inclusion

For this Compendium, long-term programs are defined as those that can be completed in 9-12 months. These include degree, non-degree, and certificate programs. A few particularly relevant programs longer than 12 months have also been included. Short-term training programs are those of less than 9 months; they range from 2 days to 7 months in length.

The following criteria were used to identify potential training institutions for inclusion in the Compendium:

Appropriate curriculum. Appropriateness was determined in the context of skill areas identified as central to the FPMT program: policy development, strategic planning, finance and budgeting, human resource management, logistics, management information systems, monitoring and evaluation, IE & C, program implementation, design of training programs, design of training cases. The applicability of the programs to international, health, and family planning applications was examined to ensure that content was relevant to developing-country personnel.

Experience in training developing-country personnel. In the case of long-term programs, for example, this includes the provision of English language training, and on-campus assistance to international students in such areas as orientation, assistance with housing, and other services.

<u>Previous work in developing countries</u>. This could encompass a variety of training and/or technical assistance activities with projects, organizations, and governments in developing countries. At best, it involves the existence of field sites and collaborative arrangements with host-country organizations.

Flexibility. This implies the capacity and willingness to create customized programs, identify and oversee internships, and/or arrange study tours.

Long-Term Training Program Listings

These programs are, with a very few exceptions, limited to those that can be completed in 9-12 months. They include:

one-year degree programs in public health, public administration, and business administration, and some certificate (non-degree) programs in these and other disciplines;

accelerated versions of degree programs that normally take 2 years to complete; these are appropriate only for exceptionally well qualified students with excellent English language skills and a strong academic background;

non-degree (certificate) programs which require only completion of 15 to 18 academic credits selected from a wide variety of courses within a degree program.

Degree programs in public health, public administration, and business administration usually include a core curriculum required of all students, and electives that may be classified into specializations or divisions. The core curricula assumed for each of these programs includes the following courses:

<u>Public Health</u> - Biostatistics, Epidemiology, Health Administration, Environmental Health.

<u>Public Administration</u> - Economics, Budget and Finance, Organizational Theory, Administration, Computer Science.

Business Administration - Accounting, Budget and Finance, Economics, Human Resource Management, Organizational Behavior, Marketing.

The cost shown for each institution is the amount of annual support required by the institution for an international student; unless otherwise indicated, it includes tuition and living expenses for a single student.

The Compendium does not include:

2-year Master's degree programs that offer no options for acceleration;

programs that are completely oriented to the US high-technology hospital-based health care model, payment methods, and regulatory and legal environments.

Short-Term Training Program Listings

Opportunities for short-term training are many and varied. They include programs designed specifically for family planners or other health personnel from developing countries; training-of-trainers programs; certificate programs in population/demography; and a variety of short programs in specific management skills, often called "Executive Programs," conducted by Schools of Business Administration or private-sector organizations. They range in length from 2 days to 7 months. Unless otherwise indicated, costs listed are for tuition only, exclusive of per diem and travel.

In addition, several programs or organizations are included in this section that 1) can develop customized courses, 2) demonstrate an orientation of particular relevance to family planning leaders and managers and/or 3) offer, within a long-term program, short-term courses for non-degree students. Many of these options have been explored and identified during institutional assessment visits by FPMT staff.

NOTE TO READERS

The information in this Compendium is current as of this writing. Participants and sponsors should check with the specific organizations/institutions for the most-up-to-date information on program requirements, course offerings, schedules, and costs.

ASCI is an independent university with a government grant, and offers approximately 75 management courses per year, including several specifically addressed to managers of primary health centers. The following short courses are offered: in-service training on management development. organizational behavior, operations research and health administration. Courses are generally of one- or two-week duration, although a few longer courses are also held. Participants come from other Asian and African countries, as well as India. The Consulting and Applied Research Division assists public and private organizations in all aspects of management. The library has over 40,000 books on management and related disciplines and subscribes to over 650 periodicals. ASCI produces a monthly journal entitled "Current Management Literature" and a bi-annual professional journal, "ASCI Journal of Management".

Courses may also be custom-designed.

ACPD also organizes and administers conferences, seminars, workshops, and field observation studies, and provides technical assistance and consultancies.

ACPD is in a modern building equipped with conference rooms and audio-visual facilities. Participants are housed in local hotels, with transportation provided to the Centre.

The teaching faculty consists of a small core staff, supplemented by field project staff and government/health senior managers. Teaching methods include lectures, group projects, and field experience.

AIM is a founding member of ICOMP (International Committee on the Management of Population Programmes), and has collaborated with ICOMP on many research and training activities.

AIM offers a master's degree in business management, a master's degree in management, and numerous short courses in management development, marketing management, program management, and rural project management, including those emphasizing family planning management.

Courses are taught in English, and can be custom-designed. The AIM center in Manila is a modern facility, with a well-equipped library, computer center, a residence hall, and sports facilities.

AIM's teaching faculty consists of 35 full-time professionals, and about 15 part-time professionals, all with post-graduate degrees in management or related fields. It offers degree and non-degree programs of varying lengths primarily to members of the West African Economic Community. In addition to seminars and short training courses, CESAG offers an MBA degree equivalent, "Le Diplome Superieur de Gestion des Enterprises". Although most of CWFP's activity takes place in Dhaka, a grant from FPIA has enabled it to expand and refine its network of FP programs - it currently covers the capital city as well as 11 urban, semi-urban and rural locations outside Dhaka.

A five and one half month Management Education Program is also available, which is similar to a condensed MBA program. Short term Management Development Programs range in length from one day to three months, may be custom-designed, and are either private sector-focused or public sector-focused. Private sector programs are offered on a regular basis and open to anyone with the appropriate job experience (i.e., a degree is not required). Public sector program participants must be sponsored, and also must have appropriate job experience. Both private and public sector programs can be topical (e.g., personnel, finance) or sectoral (e.g., rural development, family planning management). IIMA has worked closely with several state governments in Sudan in the management of population and family planning programs. IIMA also has a one-year Faculty Development Program in which teachers and researchers from universities and other training organizations can improve their skills in training and research. IIMA has 100 faculty members and about 400 students in residence at any one time. All courses are taught in English, and a variety of teaching methods are used. The case method is employed quite widely. Its modern campus includes a well-equipped library and a computer center. Course fees include room and board.
