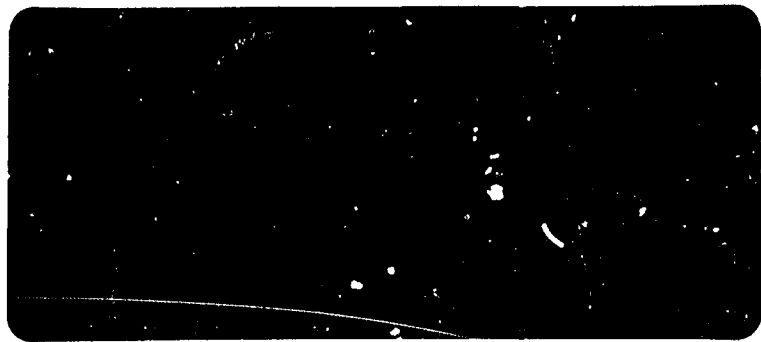

INTRODUCTION

This select bibliography of journals and newsletters on non-formal education and development is drawn from the resource collection of the NFE Information Center. Some of these citations appeared earlier in issues 6 and 12 of the NFE Exchange newsletter. In order to be most useful to development planners and practitioners, the listings have a brief annotation with full address of the publication's source. Of the nearly 300 resources identified here, we are pleased to note that 95 percent are contributions to the NFE Information Center from persons who participate in the Center's exchange network. This helps to explain the rich variety of the periodicals and the relatively limited renown of the more local materials.

We acknowledge some risk in presenting such a listing of resources, many of which are characterized by a "fugitive" and perhaps temporary nature. It is quite possible, for example, that one or more of the periodicals listed has ceased publication. A couple of others may have changed address since our last communication. Nevertheless, we think that the bibliography will prove useful to those seeking greater familiarity with the periodic literature in non-formal education and development.

As always, we welcome your comments and invite you to share with us your suggestions, ideas, and additional materials.
