



FOREWORD

Final results of the 1985 Family Income and Expenditures Survey (FIES) are presented in this report. The 1985 FIES is the most recent attempt of the National Census and Statistics Office (NCSO) to collect comprehensive data on the levels and distribution of income and expenditures among Filipino families. Similar surveys were conducted in 1957, 1961, 1965, 1971, 1975 and 1979. The surveys undertaken in 1975 and 1979, however, encountered difficulties such that the resulting data have not been published.

Data from this survey provide information on levels of living and disparities in income among various groups of families. They also provide a general idea of spending patterns of families belonging to different income groups. Moreover, these will be used as basis for updating the weights in the estimation of the consumer price index.

Unlike the preliminary report published in May 1986, which was based on summary sheets transcribed from field-edited questionnaires, this final report is a product of various processing activities. The field-edited questionnaires were verified at the Central Office of the NCSO and underwent range and consistency edits, as well as imputation for invalid items before final tabulations were made. These factors should be considered when comparing the FIES preliminary and final reports. Furthermore, the significant increase in the final total number of families is attributable to the inclusion of an adjustment for interview non-response in the estimation procedure.

This report, containing eleven statistical tables at the national and regional level is the first of two volumes to be published. Volume II will consist of regional tabulations with provincial and key city breakdowns for selected tables. Standard errors of important variables will be published as a supplemental report.

Analysis of the 1985 FIES results including comparative data from the 1961, 1965 and 1971 FIES's will be presented in a separate report. Comparability of methodology, concepts, sampling design and other related topics will also be dealt with in this separate report.

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EXPLANATORY TEXT

I. INTRODUCTION

A. Objectives of the Survey

The 1985 Family Income and Expenditures Survey (FIES) had the following primary objectives:

- 1) to gather data on family income and family living expenditures and related information affecting income and expenditure levels and patterns in the Philippines;
- 2) to determine the sources of income and income distribution, levels of living and spending patterns, and the degree of inequality among families, and
- 3) to provide benchmark information to update weights in the estimation of consumer price index.

B. Authority for Survey: Confidentiality of Data

The authority for the survey emanates from Commonwealth Act No. 591, which authorized the National Census and Statistics Office, under Section 2(d), "to conduct by enumeration, sampling or other methods, for statistical purposes, studies of social and economic problems of the country".

Like all other surveys undertaken by the NCSO, the data gathered in the 1985 FIES are for statistical purposes only and will be published in summary form. As provided for in said Act, the data will never be used for taxation, investigation or enforcement purposes.

C. Scope and Coverage

Data gathered in the survey include sources of income in cash and in kind and the level of consumption by item of expenditure. Related information such as family size, number of family members employed for pay or profit (wage/salary or own-account worker), occupation, age and educational attainment of household head, and housing characteristics were also included.

The survey involved the interview of a national sample of about 17,000 households deemed to be sufficient to provide reliable estimates of income and expenditure levels for each province of the country, including key cities. The sample households covered in the survey were the same sample households interviewed in the second and fourth quarter rounds of the 1985 Integrated Survey of Households (ISH).

In most NCSO surveys, statistics have been limited to socio-economic data at national and regional levels. For a country like the Philippines where extensive programs for development are being planned and

implemented, there is the need for information at the local level. In this regard, the survey sample design has been developed in such a way that accurate lower level classification would be possible.

The 73 provinces and 14 cities of the Philippines were covered under the following groupings:

D. Survey Design

The 1985 FIES was conducted in two separate operations using the same questionnaire. The first visit was in July with the first six months of the year as the reference period, and the second visit in January 1986 with July-December 1985 as reference period. The "shuttle-type" data collection was utilized to improve the quality of data gathered since it minimized memory bias of the respondent and at the same time captured the seasonality of income and expenditure patterns. For purposes of estimating annual data on income and expenditures the results of the first visit survey were combined with the second visit.

To further reduce memory bias, the reference period for food consumption was limited to the "past calendar week" and in some specified cases, the concept of "average week" consumption was used.

E. Sampling Design

The sampling design of the 1985 FIES adopted that of the Integrated Survey of Households of the NCSO, which used a stratified two-stage cluster sampling design.

The urban and rural areas of each province are the principal domains for the survey. In addition, cities with 150,000 or more population as of 1980 are also made domains of the survey with urban and rural dimensions. These cities are the four cities in Metro Manila (Manila, Quezon City, Pasay and Caloocan), Angeles, Olongapo, Bacolod, Iloilo, Cebu, Zamboanga, Butuan, Cagayan de Oro, Davao and Iligan.

The remainder of Metro Manila, i.e. Makati and the 12 remaining municipalities, were treated as 2 separate domains. In the case of

Makati, six exclusive villages were identified and samples were selected using a different scheme. These villages are Forbes Park, Bel-Air, Dasmarias, San Lorenzo, Urdaneta and Magallanes.

In general, the sample design resulted in a self-weighting sample within domains, with a uniform sampling fraction of 1:400 for urban areas and 1:600 for rural areas. However, special areas were given different treatment. Special areas refer to the urban or rural areas of a province or large city which are small relative to their complement. These special areas are as follows:

The primary sampling units (PSU's) under the sample design were barangays, which were classified as either urban or rural, and the households within each sample barangay comprised the secondary sampling units (SSU's). Within each domain, a pre-determined number of PSU's (based upon an approximately "proportional to size" sample allocation scheme) was selected at the first stage of sample selection procedure with probability proportional to size (PPS). Prior to selection, PSU's in each domain were ordered by population size, creating a secondary (i.e. implicit) stratification intended to improve the efficiency of the sample design. Population counts from the most recent census (i.e. 1980) were used as measures of size during first stage sample selection.

Within each PSU selected at the first stage, a pre-determined number of households (i.e. SSU's) was selected at the second stage using

a systematic random selection procedure with equal probability. The number of households chosen from each PSU took into account the probability of selecting the PSU at the first stage such that each household within the domain had an equal probability of selection for the survey (i.e. the sample was self-weighting within domains).

F. Survey Operations

All survey operations were undertaken under the technical and administrative supervision of the National Census and Household Surveys Department (NCHSD), National Census and Statistics Office (NCSO). Fieldwork was undertaken by 872 Municipal Census Officers (MCOs) and Census Field Workers (CFWs) under the guidance of 26 Regional Census Officers (RCOs) and Regional Statisticians, and 146 Provincial Census Officers (PCOs) and Provincial Statisticians.

Training was conducted in three stages. The first level training held at the Central Office, had the Task Force, RCOs and selected PCOs as participants. They acted as trainors for the second level training held in the regional offices. PCOs, Regional/Provincial Statisticians, MCOs and CFWs of the province where the regional office was located attended this training. The last stage of training for other MCOs and CFWs was conducted in provincial offices by the PCOs/Provincial Statisticians assisted by the Task Force and Regional Census Officers.

The first phase of fieldwork was undertaken from July 12, 1985 to September 14, 1985 and the second phase from January 6, 1986 to February 28, 1986. Following the completion of field operations, all survey materials were transferred to the NCSO Central Office for processing. The survey data were recorded on two types of forms: a main questionnaire which contained about 800 data items and two shorter summary forms which contained summary level information for broad categories of income and expenditures. These summary forms were edited manually and passed on to the Data Processing Staff (DPS) at the NCSO for data entry and tabulation. The summary data provided the basis for the advance release of the 1985 FIES results in May of 1986.

The main questionnaires were subjected to a rigorous battery of manual and machine edit checks for completeness, arithmetic accuracy, range validity and internal consistency. Items failing any of the edit checks were either corrected automatically (i.e. by computer) on the basis of pre-determined specifications or, when needed, examined in a clerical error-reconciliation operation. Errors which could not be reconciled on the basis of information contained in the questionnaire were assigned a special code and, along with item non-responses, subjected to "hot-deck" imputation.

A new electronic data-processing (EDP) system for processing the 1985 FIES was developed by the NCSO Data Processing Staff. The

system consisting of seven subsystems (data entry, recode, edit/update, imputation, weight generation, tabulation and variance estimation) had a total of about 50 computer programs.

G. Survey Non-Response

As in all surveys, two types of non-response were encountered in the 1985 FIES: interview non-response and item non-response. Interview non-response, that is those cases in which a sample household could not be interviewed, amounted to only 2.5 percent in the 1985 FIES, with 16,969 of the 17,495 sample households being successfully interviewed in both survey visits. Non-response cases were due to refusals and, in some cases, to critical peace and order situations which prevented entire barangays from being interviewed. Since the survey required that the same sample households be interviewed in both visits, households which transferred or could not be located in the second visit contributed to the number of non-responses.

In order to minimize the bias in the survey estimates resulting from interview non-response, a non-response adjustment factor was applied to the basic sampling weight as described in Section H below.

Item non-responses, or the failure to obtain responses to particular survey items, result from such factors as respondents being unaware of the answer to a particular question and/or being unwilling to provide the requested information, omission of questions during the interview, etc. Item non-responses were handled in two ways in the 1985 FIES. First, each questionnaire on which a non-response was observed was reviewed to determine if the proper entry for a particular missing item could be deduced from other questionnaire items (deterministic imputation). In cases where it was not possible to deduce the proper entry with a high degree of certainty, a "hot-deck" imputation procedure was utilized to select values for missing items based upon observed values for households with similar socio-economic profiles. A "random-within-cells" algorithm was utilized in carrying out the imputations, with geographic and socioeconomic factors defining groupings for imputation purposes.

H. Estimation Procedures

1. Weighting

Sampling weights, or expansion factors, were applied to the data obtained from sample households in order to derive estimates for the larger population from which the sample households were selected for the purpose of survey interviewing. The weights or expansion factors applied to each sample household reflected the probability of the households being selected for the survey sample. More specifically, the basic sampling weights assigned were equal to the inverse of the joint probability of selection in the two stages

of sample selection. Since the sample was self-weighting within domains or strata, each household in a particular stratum received the same weight.

The basic sampling for a stratum is given by:

R_h = sampling weight, or expansion factor, for the h^{th} stratum ,

P_h^{80} = the 1980 population of the h^{th} stratum ,

P_{hi}^{80} = the 1980 population of the i^{th} PSU in the h^{th} stratum ,

N_{hi} = the number of households enumerated during the survey listing operation in the i^{th} PSU of the h^{th} stratum , and

n_{hi} = the number of sample households allocated to the i^{th} PSU in the h^{th} stratum

The basic sampling weights were adjusted to take account of interview non-response through the introduction of a non-response adjustment factor applied at the stratum level. The adjusted sampling weights were derived as follows:

$$R_h^* = R_h \cdot n_h^*/n_h^*$$

where:

R_h^* = adjusted sampling weight for the h^{th} stratum ,

R_h = basic sampling weight for the h^{th} stratum,

n_h = number of sample households selected in the h^{th} stratum, and

n_h^* = number of sample households successfully interviewed in the h^{th} stratum

2. Survey Estimates

a. Stratum Estimates

Totals for the h^{th} stratum were estimated by:

x_h = estimated total for the h^{th} stratum,

R_h^* = adjusted sampling weight for the h^{th} stratum,

n_{hi} = number of households in the i^{th} PSU of the h^{th} stratum in which completed interviews were obtained, and

x_{hij} = value for the j^{th} household in the i^{th} PSU of the h^{th} stratum.

Ratios (i.e. means, proportions, and "true" ratios) for the h^{th} stratum were estimated by:

and all other terms are as defined above.

b. Provincial, Regional and National Estimates

Estimates for provinces, regions and national estimates were derived by aggregating the relevant stratum estimates.

Estimated totals were derived as:

where:

X = estimated total for a province, region or the nation as a whole,

H = number of strata included in the aggregated total, and

X_h = estimated total for the h^{th} stratum

Similarly, aggregated ratios were estimated by:

where:

X/Y = estimated ratio for a province, region or nation, and all other terms are as defined above.

I. Limitations of the Data

The user of the data presented in this report should bear in mind that the data are the results of a sample survey and accordingly are subject to sampling error. Survey estimates may also be affected by non-sampling errors, such as underreporting of income and overreporting of expenditures and reluctance on the part of the respondent to reveal their true income.

Work is presently underway at the NCSO to estimate the magnitude of sampling error for selected survey estimates at different levels of aggregation (i.e. at the national, regional, provincial and key city levels). A comprehensive evaluation of the 1985 FIES survey operations will also be undertaken. It is expected that this evaluation will provide some insight into sources and magnitude of non-sampling errors in the data. Relevant information will be released in future FIES publications to assist data users in assessing the limitations of the data for their own particular purposes.

II. DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

A. Respondent

The respondent interviewed in this survey was the household head or person who managed the finances of the family or any member of the family who could give reliable information or answers to the questionnaire.

B. Family

A family is defined as a group of persons usually living together and composed of the head and other persons related to the head by blood, marriage and adoption. For purposes of this survey, the "extended" family concept is followed. A single person living alone is considered as a separate family.

The following are the different types of household used in the survey:

1. Single family - refers to the presence of a single nuclear family in the household. It consists of a father and mother with unmarried children or presence of a parent with children. A single person household is also considered as a single family in this survey. A single family also includes unmarried sisters and brothers who are living together as one household.

2. Extended family - refers to the household composed of a nuclear family as defined above together with relatives like son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandson, granddaughter, father, mother and other relative. However, the presence of a boarder and domestic helper will not change the household type.

3. Two or More Non-Related Members - refers to a household with two or more families or two or more persons not related to each other by blood, marriage or adoption.

C. Family Size

This refers to the total number of family members enumerated. Included as family members were those whose relationship to the household head was a wife, son, daughter, father, mother, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, sister, brother, granddaughter and grandson or other relative.

D. Family Income

Total family income includes primary income and receipts from other sources received by all family members during the calendar year 1985 as participants in any economic activity or as recipients of transfers, pensions, grants, etc.

Primary income includes salaries and wages, commissions, tips, bonuses, family and clothing allowance, transportation and representation allowances, honoraria, and other forms of compensation and net receipts/profits derived from the operation of family-operated enterprises/activities and the practice of a profession or trade.

Receipts from other sources include imputed rental values of owner-occupied dwelling units, interest, rentals including landowners share of agricultural products, pensions, support and the value of food and non-food items received as gifts by the family (as well as the imputed value of services rendered free of charge to the family.)

Also included as part of family income are receipts from family sustenance activities which are not considered as family operated enterprise.

Following the International Labor Organization concept of income, the 1985 FIES excludes profits from sale of stocks and bonds, backpay and proceeds from insurance, net winnings from gambling, sweepstakes and lotteries and inheritance as part of family income. However, these are included as part of other receipts.

E. Income Decile

Two levels of income deciles were utilized in this survey - national and regional. The national income decile is obtained by ranking the weighted total family income of all sample families in the Philippines from lowest to highest. Then, these are grouped into tens. The first tenth, meaning those with the lowest income, is called the first decile; the second tenth, second decile and so on.

A similar procedure is implemented for the regional decile, except that what is arrayed is the weighted total family income of sample families in a given region.

F. Per Capita Income

Per capita income is obtained by dividing the total family income by the total number of family members.

G. Per Capita Income Decile

Similarly, two levels of per capita income decile are utilized the national and regional per capita income decile. The per capita income for the whole country are arrayed in the national per capita income decile while in the regional per capita income decile, only those in a given region. These are subsequently grouped into tens,

with the lowest comprising the first per capita income decile.

H. Main Source of Income

This refers to the source from which most of the income of the family is obtained. If the family has more than one source of income, the main source that would be considered is the source where the bulk of income is derived.

I. Salaries and Wages From Employment

It includes all forms of compensation whether in cash or in kind received by family members who are regular or occasional/seasonal workers in agricultural and non-agricultural industries.

J. Imputed Rent of Owner-Occupied Dwelling Unit

Imputed rent is the estimated amount that the owner of a dwelling unit would charge if he/she were to rent his/her entire dwelling unit monthly, unfurnished and excluding the costs for utilities. The rental value is based on the prevailing rate in the locality.

Imputed rent differs from amortization payments. Imputed rent refers to the value of the house/lot based on its utility while amortization payments refer to the periodic payments made by the family on real property they acquired on installment basis.

Imputed rent of free housing enjoyed by employees is also included.

K. Net Share of Crops, Fruits and Vegetables Produced or Livestock and Poultry Raised by Other Households

This refers to the share of harvested crops, fruits, vegetables, etc. of family from the tenant or from a fixed rental or any amount out of the produce during the reference period. It also includes the share of family from the proceeds of the sale of pig, cow, etc. which it owned but raised by others and disposed of during the reference period although there was no landlord-tenant relationship between the sample family and the one who raised it.

L. Received as Gifts

Received as gifts include all food and non-food items received in kind by the family during the reference period. For food items, alcoholic beverages and tobacco received in kind by the family, only those consumed by the family during the reference period are included. Foodstuffs received as a form of support, assistance or relief are likewise considered as gifts. However, food items, alcoholic beverages and tobacco taken by a family member at parties attended, or food items offered to him by friends are not included.

Food and non-food items received as gifts include those received from other households, charitable institutions, the government or from persons abroad, free of charge.

M. Entrepreneurial Activity

An entrepreneurial activity or a family-operated activity is any economic activity, business or enterprise whether in agricultural or in non-agricultural enterprises, engaged by any member of the family as an operator or as self-employed.

Included as family-operated activities are those which are operated as single proprietorship or loose partnership (without formal organization). Thus, partnerships, corporation, associations, etc. which are formally organized are excluded.

N. Family Sustenance Activity

A family sustenance activity is also a family activity but unlike an entrepreneurial activity, the produce from the former is mainly for home consumption. Occasionally, sales are made when harvests/produce are more than enough for family consumption.

O. Family Expenditure

Family expenditures refer to the expenses or disbursements made by the family purely for personal consumption during the calendar year 1985. They exclude all expenses in relation to farm or business operations, investment ventures, purchase of real property and other disbursements which do not involve personal consumption.

Gifts, support, assistance or relief in goods and services received by the family from friends, relatives, etc. are also included as part of family expenditures.

Value consumed from net share of crops, fruits and vegetables produced or livestock* raised by other households, family sustenance and entrepreneurial activities are also considered as family expenditures.

Food Consumed at Home -

The items included in this portion covers the actual consumption (not expenditure) of the family during the past week. This category includes the food prepared at home and those home-cooked food bought outside the home and eaten elsewhere like in place of work, school, etc.

Food consumption covers only the actual consumption of the family, its domestic helpers as well as persons employed by the family to do odd jobs around the house, and family guests (relatives or non-relatives who are not members of the household but had stayed with or visited the family for a certain length of time less than a week within the past week). The consumption of boarders and other persons in the same household unrelated to the family is excluded from this category.

Food Regularly Consumed Outside the Home -

This includes food regularly bought and eaten by the family members outside the home like snacks, merienda, lunch, etc. The daily allowance of school children for their sandwiches, softdrinks, etc. at school are also covered by this category.

P. Fuel, Light and Water

This refers to the total family consumption of fuel, light and water consumed during the reference period.

For family who shares facilities with other households, only an estimate of the family's consumption is included. However, consumption of fuel, light and water used in a business either operated by the family or sharing a part of the house is excluded.

Q. Non-Durable Furnishings

This includes the value of all non-durable furnishings such as utensils and accessories (dinnerware, glassware, silverware, kitchen utensils, etc.) for family use acquired within the reference period including those bought/received for use during special occasions of the family.

If the non-durables are made at home for family use, the total value of the materials and the cost of labor paid are reported as the value of the finished products. However, the value of labor rendered by a household member free of charge is not included.

R. Durable Furniture and Equipment

This includes all durable furnishings or equipment such as pieces of furniture, garden tools, appliances, cars, etc. acquired on a cash basis during the reference period and intended for family use during ordinary days or during special occasions.

Those durable furniture and equipment purchased on installment basis during the reference period are also included. The total value which is the total installments paid plus initial downpayment made on the item during the reference period is reported on this portion.

Durable furniture made at home for family use are also reported in this part, hence, the value included is the value of the materials used and the cost of labor paid. Value of labor rendered by any member of the household free of charge is not included.

S. Taxes

The following forms of taxes were included in the survey:

1. Income Tax - refers to the tax levied on a working person in pursuit of his occupation.

2. Real Estate Tax - refers to the tax imposed on real property of the family (e.g. house and lot for family use) in proportion to its value. This includes real estate tax levied on real property of the family used for personal purposes. Therefore, taxes levied on private properties of the family used solely for business purposes are excluded.

3. Car Registration, Toll Fees and Driver's License - this includes registration fees for motor vehicles used for private transport of the family, toll fees, etc.

4. Other Direct Taxes - direct taxes refers to taxes which are demanded from a taxpayer, who also shoulders the burden of the tax; or tax which the taxpayer cannot shift to another. Specific examples are inheritance tax, alien certificate of registration (ACR), donor's tax, etc. Other taxes paid by the family such as custom's duties paid for personal effects bought from abroad, amusement and taxes paid as a consumer, etc. are also included.

T. Other Receipts

These are non-income receipts comprising of value at cost of real and personal property sold, loans from other households, business firms and government institutions, payments for loans granted to others and withdrawals from savings or business equity. Profits from sale of stocks and bonds, backpay and proceeds from insurance, net winnings from gambling, sweepstakes and lotteries and inheritance are also included as other receipts.

U. Other Disbursements

Other disbursements refer to non-family expenditures which may give an indication of savings on the part of the family. These include purchase or amortization of real property, payments of cash loan (principal), installments for appliances bought before 1985, installments for personal transport bought before 1985, loans granted to persons outside the household, amount deposited in banks or investments and major repair or construction of a house.

V. Urban-Rural Areas

1. In their entirety, all cities and municipalities having a population density of at least 1,000 persons per square kilometer.

2. Poblaciones or central districts of municipalities and cities which have a population density of at least 500 persons per square kilometer.

3. Poblaciones or central districts (not included in 1 and 2), regardless of the population size, which have the following:

- a. Street pattern, i.e. network of streets in either parallel or right angle orientation;
- b. At least six establishments (commercial, manufacturing, recreational and/or personal services);
- c. At least three of the following:
 - 1) A town hall, church or chapel with religious services at least once a month;
 - 2) A public plaza, park or cemetery;
 - 3) A public market or building where trading activities are called on at least once a week;
 - 4) A public building like school, hospital, puericulture and health center or library.

4. Barangays having at least 1,000 inhabitants which meet the conditions set forth in 3 above, and where the occupation of inhabitants is predominantly non-farming or non-fishing.

All areas not falling under any of the above classifications are considered rural.

W. Medians and Averages; Rounding of Estimates

Medians and averages are computed from unrounded figures. All absolute figures are independently rounded to the nearest thousand; hence, the group total may not always be equal to the sum of the individual figures.

Percentages are computed from unrounded absolute figures and may not always add up to exactly 100.0 percent because of rounding. The total percent, however, is always shown as 100.0.
