Also included in this document are brief trade magazine articles covering the Saudia Arabian (+ selected fresh produce importers names/addresses), Singapore and Hongkong markets.

AgEnt's business information center has on file the names/addresses of key fresh produce importers etc relating to both the Singapore and Hongkong markets.





Trading Structures in Dubai

When in the early eighties the fruit and vegetable market moved from the cramped quarters of the fish market on the Deira side of Dubai Creek to the large vacant site on the beach, everyone knew it was only a stopgap solution. And every time you paid a visit to the Hamriya Market in the following years you were surprised to find it still in the same place. *Prakash Doshi* of the Natco company, a member of the Market Commission, describes the situation as "untenable". The municipal authorities are not happy either because it is right opposite the new central hospital, a prestige project in the Emirate, and the wholesale market with its noise, dirt and emissions is hardly a welcome neighbour. A new site in the south appears to have been found now, but in Dubai as elsewhere, the mills of officialdom grind slowly.

In the wake of the Iraq-Iran war and the recent Gulf conflict, Hamriya Market has further consolidated its position as the region's trading hub for fresh fruit and vegetables. The rather liberal attitude of the ruling family is a great help to trade. The market can be divided into two halves. On the one side are the established traders, importers and exporters with their stalls, and on the other what the market folk call the "coldstore". There is not really a coldstore in Hamriya: it was never planned for the present provisional setup. But the twenty to fifty desert-rigged trucks with their refrigerated bodies which bring in produce from Lebanon, Jordan, Syria and Turkey are allowed to stay on the market grounds for 48 or up to 72 hours and thus represent not just a refrigeration facility but also a coldstore from which produce is sold and auctioned fresh, mostly after sundown. Thus the Emirate's supply sources include its Arab neighbours as well as its own increasing production.

Whereas only the eastern emirates like Ras-al-Khaimah supplied horticultural products in the past, growers from Abu







Dhabi have now also been able to get established with massive help from the sheikdom. As a result vegetable supplies to the United Emirates are assured for at least nine months of the year (the exception being the summer months). And not only that: produce is also exported to neighbouring countries and to Europe (see IFW 1/1991 p. 267).

The Emirate's third supply channel consists of regional trade, mainly Iran, Pakistan and India. Fruit and vegetables are shipped across the Gulf or the Indian Ocean in dhows, small motorized sailing ships, for which the port authority has established a separate port, Port Hamriya, near the market. Apples, pistachios and vegetables from Iran and citrus fruit (Kano oranges from Pakistan and the Punjab), mangoes and vegetables from Pakistan and India enter Dubai this way. Packaging is not as a rule export-oriented, so losses are high. Quality consciousness among Dubai consumers remains largely undeveloped but there are pointers in the right direction, say trade representatives. Increasing quantities of overseas produce are reaching Dubai in refrigerated containers and by airfreight.

Three-stage fruit trade in Dubai

Dubai fruit traders can be roughly divided into three categories. First there are the agents representing large organizations like Chiquita, Dole and Sumitomo. They maintain offices in Dubai and coldstores in Sharjah, the emirate next door.

The second stage comprises the commission agents whose activities consist mainly in trucking in supplies from the Turkish part of Cyprus, Greece, Jordan, Syria, Egypt and Lebanon. The produce is sold at auction and paid for in cash.

Besides hauling perishable products from Jordan, Syria, Lebanon and Turkey, these largely all-terrain desert-rigged trucks also serve as "coldstores" at Hamriya Market, where they are allowed to stay for 48 hours, or 72 hours with special permission.



The third category of trader features airfreight and seacontainer specialists as well as numerous firms who rely on tamily ties for dealing directly with Iran, Pakistan and India.

Overseas imports are grapes, bananas, apples and oranges

Amir A. Abu-Ghazaleh of Middle East Trading and Industry views the prospects for imported produce as generally good.

His firm brings in 10,000-12,000 t oranges from Brazil and Uruguay and 11,000 t Chiquita bananas. He says business with Chile is growing significantly. Table grapes from Chile and other countries total a further 10,000 t. Ribier is the most popular variety.

The Emirates' apple market is supplied by Iran with Golden and Red Delicious. This sometimes results in a pattern of regular and largely dutyfree barter trade across the Gulf, with apples being exchanged for bananas. The small dhows make the crossing from Bandar Abbas to Dubai in just twelve hours. French and Italian apples account for a significant process.

Natco Foodstuff specializes in Indian produce *Prakash Doshi* imports mainly white grapes from Maharashtra and mangoes from southern Rajasthan and Maharashtra

he Khamas group dates back to Grandfather Yussuf who ifter 1945 positioned the firm in business with India and 'akistan and was himself the owner of three dhows. Still run by Jassim and Ahmed Khamas, this trade represents the ompany's pranapal line of business with a total turnover of to 10 million dirhams. In addition to coconuts, garlic and potatoes, the small boats carry fruit and meat to Port famriya, not to mention timber which is used for house building in desert areas.

The firm's first small office was opened in the Deira fish narket in the late sixties. The group is now not just a major mporter but also grows its own fruit and vegetables. Chamas produces vegetables, above all tomatoes, at Zaid Dasis, though as Jassim Khamas says, the operation is hard pressed by competition from Abu Dhabi. The Dubai Emirate igricultural policy needs a complete rethink, says Khamas. In Abu Dhabi the ruling circles, while supporting the farmers, end to foster average quality. "In Dubai they are only interested in trade", Khamas laments. Ahmed Khamas hows off the difference between Pakistani and Indian mangoes at the start of the season (May). "The Pakistani ones are nuch better."

Tomplaints about the condition of the produce are widepread among traders. But it is not for lack of trying to incourage the consumption of better-quality and hence nore expensive products. Jassim Khamas estimates leliveries of Indian mangoes at 20,000 to 50,000 cases for he period 1 April to 30 June. 5,000 to 25,000 cases a day irrive from Pakistan in the high season, July to September. he Farzana Trading Company belongs to the brothers Mohammed and Shokrulla Hassan Ali. According to



Mohammed Hassan Ali, Farzana Trading Company

Mohammed, who sources from Iran, Jordan, Lebanon and he United States, apples, pears, table grapes and oranges account for the bulk of sales. Farzana is content with sales developments since the end of the Gulf war. "We sell ornatoes, cauliflower and cucumbers from domestic production but are not actually involved in farming ourselves", explains Mohammed Hassan Ali. These vegetables are preenhouse-grown from December to April. Eggs account or one third of the firm's US\$13m turnover.

Part 1 United Arab Emirates

General information



National flag: red vertical strip along the hoist for one quarter of the length, equal horizontal stripes of green, white and black in descending order for the remainder. The flag is twice as long as deep.

Background

The United Arab Emirates (UAE), established in December 1971, comprises the seven former Trucial States: Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Sharjah, Ajman, Umm al-Quwain, Ras al-Khaimah and Fujairah. The federation borders on Saudi Arabia, Qatar and Oman. Its total land area is approximately 83,600 square kilometres. The so-called Northern Emirates, that is, all the emirates except Abu Dhabi, cover less than one third of the country. The population of the UAE is officially estimated at 1.61 million (1986) and is concentrated mainly in the capitals of the individual emirates which lie on the UAE's two coastlines; the Gulf and the Gulf of Oman. Arabic is the national language, but English is widely understood in business circles. The country's unit of currency, the UAE dirham (Dh) is divided into 100 fils. The dirham is officially tied to the US dollar (average bank rate \$1 = Dh 3.67). The current sterling exchange rate is approximately £1 = Dh 5.7. Islam is the principal religion.

The UAE is a sovereign state, a member of the United Nations, the Gulf Co-operation Council, the Arab League, the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries, the International Monetary Fund and other international and Arab organisations. The President is Shaikh Zayed bin Sultan al-Nahayyan of Abu Dhabi and the Vice-President Shaikh Rashid bin Saeed al-Maktoum of Dubai. The ultimate authority in the UAE rests with the Federal Supreme Council, made up of the rulers of the seven individual emirates. It is supported by a council of ministers (which meets in Abu Dhabi, the federal capital) and the Federal National Council (a consultative body). Each emirate retains a high degree of self-administration.

GENERAL INFORMATION 9

Language

The official language is Arabic, although English is widely spoken in business circles. Merchants who do not speak English have their own interpreters.

Weights and measures

British and American standard weights and measures, as well as the metric system, are understood by most merchants. Local weights and measures are also used occasionally, but rarely in international trade.

British Businessmen's Group

A British Businessmen's Group has been formed recently in Dubai. Details are available from Mr C Neil, Lloyds Bank Plc. PO Box 3766, Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

Local law and customs

The UAE is a Muslim State and Islamic laws and customs are observed. Visitors should acquaint themselves with these, especially on matters of dress, drinking and other social behaviour. The month of Ramadhan is a period of fasting when Muslims do not eat, drink or smoke between sunrise and sunset. Non-Muslims should refrain from breaking the fast (including smoking) in the presence of Muslims or in public places during this period. Friday is observed as the weekly day of rest. Drunkenness and especially drunken driving carry heavy penalties — nearly always imprisonment.

Health

With the exception of malaria (particularly in the more northerly Emirates) for which visitors are advised to take paludrine, there are few endemic diseases, but Europeans are susceptible to occasional bouts of mild enteritis and prickly-heat. Dubai's domestic water supply is now provided almost entirely by distillation plants, whereas in Sharjah the supply is a mixture of desalinated and well water. In both cases the water is perfectly drinkable. The town supply for Abu Dhabi is provided by distillation plants.

Medical facilities in Abu Dhabi, Dubai and Sharjah are good, and they are adequate elsewhere.

There are European doctors and dentists in private practice.

Health regulations

Health certificates are not generally required, although restrictions have been imposed on visitors travelling from an infected area.

Electricity supply

The electricity supply in Abu Dhabi is 240 volts AC50 cycles, and in the Northern Emirates 220 volts AC50 cycles.

Plug fittings of the three-pin round (15-amp) or flat (13-amp) type, and bayonet-type lamp fittings are used in all the Emirates.

Religion

Islam is the prin ipal religion.

There is an Anglican church and a Roman Catholic church in Abu Dhabi town with resident chaplains. There is an Inter-denominational and a Roman Catholic church in Dubai.

Travel



Passports and visas
The UAE authorities are responsible for all

immigration matters.

British citizens visiting the UAE—British citizens do not need a visa to visit Abu Dhabi. However, British passport holders who are subject to United Kingdom immigration control do need visas, which may be obtained from UAF embassies abroad.

Passengers, arriving in Abu Dhabi by air with defaced or damaged passports, can face long delays, or on occasions be refused entry. British Visitors Passports are not acceptable, while standard passports must have minimum validity of six months.

Visitors are admitted for one month initially; this can normally be extended for two further periods of 30 days. British citizens who enter the UAE as visitors can obtain a Residence/Work permit after arrival, but are strongly advised to seek guidance from the UAE Embassy (see below) or their prospective employer/sponsor, before travelling to the UAE. Failure to comply with UAE immigration rules can resu in stiff penalties, including imprisonment. British nationals taking up residence in Abu Dhabi should register with the British Embassy Consular Section as soon as possible after they arrive. The renewal of the registration should be done every January by telephone. Changes of address and final departure should also be notified.

Visitor's visas — All non-British and British passport holders, not coming under the above, require a visa, obtained in advance. They should apply to the Consular Section of the Embassy of the United Arab Emirates. 30 Princes Gate, London SW7—tel: 071-589 3434 for a visitor's visa. Business visitors will need a supporting letter from their company. The delay in issuing the visa is approximately 24 hours for a business visitor and about three weeks for a private visitor.

Israel and South Africa Travellers holding passports which bear evidence of a visit or a proposed visit to Israel or South Africa will need to obtain a new passport to visit the United Arab Emirates. Travellers who are likely to be affected by this situation should consult their nearest regional Passport Office in London, Liverpool, Glasgow, Newport (Gwent), Peterborough, Belfast, or if overseas, the nearest British Consulate or High Comunission.

Transit visas

Business visitors arriving without visas may be admitted for up to two weeks if they are met at the airport by a sponsor bearing his own passport as proof of identity and a copy of his trade licence. The sponsor will be required to sign an undertaking that he accepts responsibility for the visitor and guarantees that he will leave within 14 days. The British Embassy cannot sponsor visitors. Fees are levied on visitors who overstay at the rate of Dh 100 per day.

Residence or employment People who wish to enter the United Arab Emirates for residence or employment should ensure that their prospective employers have arranged for a work or residence permit to be issued prior to their arrival. This must be produced to the immigration officer at the point of entry. If this procedure is not followed, the entrant will only be given a visitor's entry permit (see above).

Travel between the Emirates No additional visa or permit is required to visit other Emirates if a valid visitor's visa or resident's permit, issued by the authorities of one of the Emirates, is already held.

Travel regulations are liable to change at short notice; and intending visitors are advised to consult their travel agent or the United Arab Emirates' representative in London, before departure.

Documentation for travel to other Middle East countries

Visitors intending to go to other Middle East countries are strongly advised to obtain, before leaving Britain, any visa or other documentation which may be required, since not all countries have representatives in the UAE. Business visitors should note that it is not always possible to obtain a visa for Saudi Arabia through that country's offices in the UAE. Only businesspeople resident in the UAE can apply for Saudi visas.

Currency

The monetary unit of the Emirates is the Dirham (Dh), which is divided into 100 fils. Exporters should consult their banks for the current rate of exchange. Bank-notes are issued in denominations of Dh 500, 200, 100, 50, 10 and 5.

Coins are issued in denominations of 5 and 1 Dirhams, and 50, 25, 10, 5 and 1 fils.

Currency regulations

There are no restrictions on the amount of currency which may be taken into or out of the Emirates. Credit cards such as American Express, Diners Club, Barclaycard, Access, Visa and Mastercard are widely accepted.

Customs formalities

Visitor's personal effects are not liable to customs duty in the UAE. For regulations regarding samples, see page 45.

Income tax clearance

No income tax clearance certificates are required on departure from the Emirates.

Air travel to the Emirates

British Airways operate direct flights from London to Abu Dhabi and Dubai. Emirates Air also offers a direct flight to Dubai; other airlines also provide services to these airports, but the journey usually involves a stop or transfer at an intermediate airport. Gulf Air, the regional airline, operates regular services between the major airports in the area. New international airports are operational at Sharjah, Ras al-Khaimah and Fujairah, with a more limited choice of flights.

Distances of airports from town centre:
Abu Dhabi — 25 miles
Dubai — 2 miles
Sharjah — 18 miles
There are local airport taxes.

Travel in the Emirates

Road Most visitors find it convenient to travel between Abu Dhabi and Dubai by taxi. The distance is approximately 160 kms and the journey time is approximately two hours. There is a well developed road network throughout the Emirates.

Driving is on the right-hand side of the road.

Taxis These are available in the towns. The cost of hiring a taxi for sole use from Abu Dhabi to Dubai is Dh 250. The fare from the airport in Abu Dhabi to Dubai is Dh 250. The fare from the airport in Abu Dhabi to the town is approximately Dh 60. The taxi fare from Dubai Airport to the town centre is approximately Dh 30.

In Abu Dhabi Town taxis operate a meter. Taxis operating from stands outside hotels charge higher fares i.e. Dh 5 or more for a local journey, as compared with Dh 3.50 for a town metered taxi.

Business visitors wishing to drive hired cars in Abu Dhabi must obtain a temporary driving licence. These can be obtained from car-hire companies in Abu Dhabi and Dubai. Passport, two passport photographs and United Kingdom licence must be produced. An International licence is not acceptable.

Costs average Dh 170-200 per day, (excluding insurance), for a 4-door saloon such as a Datsun or a Mazda.

It is possible to drive in Dubai on a United Kingdom or USA driving licence, but if business visitors wish to travel to other Emirates they will have to obtain a temporary UAE driving licence.

Up to one day should be allowed for the issue of a local temporary driving licence, although application made before 9am may ensure the issue of the licence by noon.

In Dubai rates vary from Dh 120 to Dh 450 per day, depending upon the make of car. It is usually cheaper to rent on a weekly or monthly basis. Rates are for unlimited mileage, although some companies have a limit of 100 kms and charge for excess mileage at Dh 0.5 or Dh 0.8 per km.

Avis Rent-a-Car now agrees a special discount for rentals, if booked using the name of the Enibassy. Some car-hire companies have desks in the larger hotels.

Tipping


Abu Dhabi:-

Most catering establishments add a service charge—so tipping is not therefore very prevalent. There is no need to tip taxi-drivers and the small payments to airporters (Dirham 1 per item) and market porters (Dirham 2 per shopping session) are normal payments for service.

Northern Emirates:—
10 per cent service charge and 5 per cent tax are added to the bill.
Airport and hotel porters:
Dh 2 per piece of luggage
Taxi-drivers:
No tip is necessary.

Recreation

Several hotels have their own sports facilities. Additionally, Al Nasr Leisureland; tel: Dubai 471234, provides squash, bowling and ice-skating, and is open for day membership to non-members.



Communications



Post

Mail services (air and surface) are in operation between the UAE and Britain.

Air mail letters and parcels are despatched daily and take three to seven days to reach Britain. Surface mail can take up to two months.

British exporters are advised to despatch all mail by air or courier service.

Parcels may be sent from the UAE to most places by sea or by air, provided they are not larger than 42 inches in length and 30 inches in width, and weigh no more than 10 kilogrammes. Express postal services are available at premium rates.

Telegrams

There are telegraph offices in all the Emirates, operated by ETISALAT, the UAE Telecommunications Company formed by the Federal Government in 1976.

The ordinary telegram rate to Britain is Dh 1.85 a word for a minimum of 22 words. Telegrams can be sent to Britain at any time of the Gay or night. Urgent telegrams are double the ordinary rate.

Telex and telefax

International telex and telefax facilities operated by ETISALAT are available in all the Enrirates. The cost of a telex to Britain is Dh 11.60 per minute. Teletext has recently been introduced.

Telephone

There are efficient automatic telephone systems by either radio or land links connecting Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Sharjah, Ajman, Umm al-Quwain, Ras al-Khaimah and Fujairah. Local calls within each town are free.

Telephone communications are excellent to most parts of the world.

The cost of a direct telephone call from Abu Dhabi to Britain is Dh 6.67 per minute between 7am and 9pm local time and Dh 4.28 per minute between 9pm and 7am and during holidays.

The charge for a telephone call to Britain from Dubai is Dh 9.40 per minute, and Dh 7.50 if direct dialling is used. The international dialling code from the UAE to the United Kingdom is 0044.

Economic factors



General

Abu Dhabi The economy of Abu Dhabi is based almost entirely on oil and gas obtained from both onshore and offshore fields. In 1988, Abu Dhabi's oil production averaged 1,330,000 barrels per day (bpd), an increase of seven per cent over 1987. Abu Dhabi is said to have some 10 per cent of the world's proven oil reserves and 4.6 per cent of the world's gas reserves, enough oil for more than 100 years at current rates of production.

The oil and gas sector is dominated by the Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC), established in 1971 to provide greater national control of the most important source of Enlirate income. Since then, ADNOC has acquired a 60 per cent thareholding in two of the main operating companies, the Abu Dhabi Company for Onshore Oil Operations (ADCO) and the Abu Dhabi Marine Operating Company (ADMA-OPCO). In addition, ADNOC has 88 per cent of the concession for developing the Upper Zakum field, with the remaining 12 per cent held by the Japanese Oil Development Company (JODCO). This development is carried out by the Zakum Development Company (ZADCO).

ADNOC also has a majority shareholding in two gas-development companies, the onshore Abu Dhabi Gas Industries (GASCO) and the Abu Dhabi Gas Liquefaction Company (ADGAS), with a large plant on Das Island.

Outside the oil and gas sectors, the main activity is stimulated by the Government. Abu Dhabi government expenditure on major projects shows signs of picking up, following the post-oil crash recession. These plans include: the provision for the expansion of the Taweelah power station and associated desalination plant; a new international airport at Al Ain, currently under construction and due for completion in 1991; a programme to upgrade the road network in and around Abu Dhabi city; a number of new hospitals; major water

and electricity distribution systems, as well as major sewerage programmes for Al Ain and Abu Dhabi city and the construction of a number of Polytechnics. There are also long-standing plans to develop a new campus for the UAE University in Al Ain, to cater for 16,000 students by the end of the century, but it is looking increasingly unlikely that this project will go ahead on anything like the ambitious scale originally envisaged. There is also a very large defence budget. Most of the infrastructural work is now complete, and the emphasis is turning to upgrading replacement of ageing plant and equipment. In the longer term, potential development will depend upon the price of oil in the international market and greater non-oil related industrialisation, and further downstream diversification in the oil, gas and petroleum secto:s.

The Northern Emirates Dubai is the main port and import centre for the United Arab Emirates and has a widespread re-export trade to other Gulf States, the Indian subcontinent, and, to Iran. Trade with the latter, which has always been substantial, is expected to escalate as a consequence of the cessation of hostilities between Iran and Iraq. Dubai also serves as a market for the other emirates which, except for Abu Dhabi and Sharjah, at present import little direct. Dubai's prosperity was established on this import-export trade and now oil production has brought a new source of wealth to the State. Oil production from its offshore resource began in September 1969 and reached an average daily rate estimated at 350,000/400,000 barrels per day. A major expansion programme for greater exploitation of the orfshore fields and for additional gas processing capacity was completed in 1984. Oil income has been used to finance a number of major construction projects over the past 10 years, including: an international airport; a large deep water port; a £210 million dry-dock complex; a £10 million international trade and exhibition centre; the £800 million port and industrial area at Jebel Ali, and a £700 million aluminium smelter, all of which are projects in which British consultants, contractors and suppliers played a dominant part.

In 1982 Dubai's first onshore discoveries were made by ARCO (Atlantic Richfield) who have a joint venture with Britoil for this Margham concession. Production of condensate began in 1984 at 20,000-25,000 bdp. British Gas, who are advisers on the utilisation and potential of this field, predict that eventually the lift could be as great as 1 billion cfd of gas. There are no plans for downstream development, as yet. All the gas is re-injected, to increase the pressure and produce more condensate.

Total imports into Dubai have been flat over the past four years at just under Dh 20 billion annually. British exports of goods to Dubai in 1988 were valued at about £325 million. Over 80 countries supply the market. Industrialisation, still in its early stages, provides a market for such items as packaging machinery, process control equipment and sophisticated machine-tools. Almost all goods find a market, although import of construction-related products has decreased with the ending of the construction boom of the 1970's and completion of much of Dubai's infrastructure. Dubai is an important import centre for the oil industry in the Gulf.

Jebel Ali Fice Trade Zone A major and growing industrial area established by decree of the Dubai Govert ment, the zone has attracted a wide range of industrial development. It is actively canvassing international companies to set up trading and industrial bases in the zone. Current British investment is estimated at £50 million.

Sharjah In Sharjah, Crescent Petroleum commenced production from Abu Musa Island, off the Sharjah coast, in July 1974; and production from this field is approximately 7,500 bpd, but is expected to more than double. Although the field is under the control of Sharjah, settlement of complicated boundary questions left it with only 35 per cent of the revenues, with Iran, Umm al-Quwain and Ajman also taking shares. The modest income from oil nevertheless led to a construction boom including a deep water port, a cement works, an international airport and various hotel projects. Finance of these projects has left a legacy of debt. Oil and gas were discovered onshore in Sharjah in 1981, and exports of condensate began in mid-1982. This has been a considerable boost to her fortunes. Production has since risen to 55,000-60,000 bpd of condensate and 500 mcfd of gas. The operator of this field is AMOCO. The construction of an industrial gas grid based on this onshore resource was completed in

1984. This federal scheme, under the control of the Emirates General Petroleum Corporation, is designed to provide fuel for the power stations and major industrial users throughout the Northern Emirates (except Dubai and, so far, Umm al-Quwain). A \$250 million lpg plant came into operation in mid-1986.

Ras al-Khaimah Oil was struck offshore in the 1970's but quantities were insufficient for commercial exploitation. In 1983, a significant discovery of condensate and gas was made offshore. Production in the Saleh field began in 1984. Condensate production is currently about 5,500 bpd.

Saleh 6, drilled in 1986, did not live up to expectations and production has been falling sharply. Saleh 7, the latest well, has produced 1,750 bpd of oil and 14.8 msef of gas under test. The offshore company RAKOPET (Ras Al-Khaimah Offshore Petroleum Company) operates the field on behalf of Wintershall AG and International Petroleum Corporation.

It was previously operated by Chevron, following that company's take-over of Gulf Oil. Early in 1986, the Ras al-Khaimah Government, in the shape of the Ras al-Khaimah National Oil Company, renegotiated the concession, and the Ras al-Khaimah Government now takes a royalty of 20 per cent on the condensate.

In April 1985, an 1pg plant constructed by McDermott International at a cost of US\$50 million began operations. A maximum of 44 mcfd of gas is brought ashore from the Saleh field and yields about 850 bpd of 1pg sold to Dugas; 280 bpd of condensate is also derived from this source.

In September 1987, IPC received the entire onshore concession of over 500,000 acres.

Ajman Following the successful completion in 1983 of a first well (onshore — drilled by Sedco), the Ajman Government commissioned the Kuwaiti-owned Santa Fé International company to undertake further drilling. Condensates at a total rate of 400 bpd from two wells were indicated and this is insufficient to be viable commercially.

Offshore, a seismic survey was conducted by Western Geophysical Surveys (US) in the hope that Sharjah's Mubarak field will extend into Ajman territorial waters. Umm al-Quusin This emirate is on the north/south line of the discoveries in Ras al-Khaimah, Sharjah and Dubai, but so far they have been unable to cap it. Exploration made several years ago came to nothing apart from a limited offshore gas find (which was later capped) and a more determined attempt by Texaco Deutsche to a depth of 17,000 ft was proved dry in 1983.

Fujairah Being entirely on the east coast and generally regarded as geologically different, Fujairah has not so far benefited from the newly discovered run in the west. Drilling in the past offshore has encountered nothing. BHP (Australia) drilled a well, which was dry, in Omani waters off Fujairah in 1988. Further drilling is to take place.

Purchasing power

Abu Dhabi Due notice should be taken of the composition of the Abu Dhabi population (see page 10). A high proportion of the immigrants are poor labourers from Pakistan, India and other countries. Generally, the market is a price one, not a quality-conscious one, in which competition from foreign suppliers is strong.

The Northern Emirates — Dubai's extensive merchant community has grown affluent from the import/ re-export trade. Imports, especially of consumer goods, bear little relation to the relatively small home market of the Emirates. Competition is fierce in several sectors of the market; price remains more important than quality in general, but the market in certain sectors is becoming increasingly quality-conscious.

Imports and exports

Abu Dhabi Abu Dhabi's needs are imported mainly from Europe, the USA and the Far East. In 1989, total imports into Abu Dhabi were approximately DH 7.4 billion. In 1989 UK exports to Abu Dhabi were £155 million. There is a small re-export trade, mainly to other Gulf States.

Dubai and the Northern Emirates—In 1989, total imports into Dubai were valued at Dh 22.5 billion cif. A large proportion of goods imported into Dubai is re-exported

to other Gulf States, Iran, Pakistan, India, etc., and this amounted to Dh 5.1 billion. In 1989, UK exports to Dubai and the Northern Emirates totalled £416 million.



Import and exchange control regulations



The latest available information about import duties, import control regulations, taxes, and any other legislation in the United Arab Emirates affecting British exports, may be obtained from Overseas Trade Division (OTD) of the Department of Trade and Industry (see page 84).

Exchange control

There is no Exchange Control in the UAE. Transfers may be made freely to all parts of the world.

Customs duties

General:

Although UAE Customs authorities formally applied the Gulf Co-operation Council minimum tariff of four per cent on its inception, they have since reduced the general customs duties to one per cent. As in the GCC scheme, foodstuffs, medicines and basic materials for local industries continue to be exempted.

(a) Abu Dhabi:

Customs duties are levied on the cif value. Duty on alcoholic beverages is 25 per cent, and on cigarettes and tobacco products 31 per cent. Many items are exempt from duty, particularly foodstuffs, medicines and public sector imports.

(b) The Northern Emirates:

Throughout the Northern Emirates the rate of duty on alcoholic beverages, cigarettes and tobacco is 30 per cent.

(c) Dubni:

Customs duties are levied on the cif value. Some goods, including all transit cargo, are exempt from duty, although the customs authorities may call for a cash or bank guarantee as security, refundable to the owner of the goods, after their re-export outside the UAE. There are free zone facilities at Jebel Ali and at Port Rashid (Dubai).

(d) Sharjah:

Customs duties are levied on the cif value. Some goods are exempt from duty. There is a free zone at Port

(e) Ras al Khaimah:

Customs duties are levied on the cif value. The rate of duty at the time of print on most goods is four per cent - the only current adherence amongst UAE ports to recent GCC regulations. Some goods are exempt from customs duty.

Import control

The following goods require an import licence: alcoholic beverages; arms and ammunition; narcotics, and agricultural pesticides Various items have other import controls on them, while some such as opium and any form of pornographic material are strickly prohibited.

There are no duties on samples imported into Abu Dhabi, provided that packaging is clearly marked to indicate that the goods are not for sale.

Import duty is not usually levied on samples imported into Dubai and the Northern Emirates. However, for those of high value such as jewellery, prior permission to import and arrangements for free entry must be made with the Director of Customs, preferably through a local sponsor or agent.

Samples taken in by visitors should be accompanied by an invoice showing the value and cartificate of origin.

Forwarding/clearing agents

Names and addresses of agents in the UAE and Oman are retained in the Overseas Trade Division (OTD) of the Department of Trade and Industry. Exporters wishing to avail themselves of this service can do so by writing to this Division, address on page 84.

Documentation

A commercial invoice giving full details is required. It should bear a supplier's certified statement of origin. There are no special requirements for the bill of lading. A certificate of origin issued by a Chamber of Commerce is required, bearing the name and address of the producing firm. Authentication of the certificate is required for Abu Dhabi and Dubai. This may be done by the United Arab Emirates' Embassy, 30 Princes Gate, London SW7 or any other Arab embassy.

This procedure may be varied in certain circumstances to require reference via the Arab-British Chamber of Commerce, 6 Belgrave Square, London SW1X 8PH; tel: 071-235 4363; telex: 22171 AP ABRI G; fax: 071-245 6688. (See also page 92).

Port and warehouse facilities

Abu Dhabi's port, Mina Zayed, is operated by the Seaports Authority and provides 21 deep water berths. including a container terminal. Adequate warehousing is available.

There is no waiting time as there are adequate berths available to cover required capacity; and goods are cleared through customs without any particular problems, provided the paperwork is in order.

Dubai's Port Rashid is one of the busiest ports in the Gulf and has 35 berths. Container traffic now forms a large slice of business at the port and facilities for handling container traffic are second to none. The port also has ro-ro facilities. Warehouse facilities provide covered storage for imports and there are no storage charges for the first 20 days. Jebel Ali Port, 35 kms south-west of Dubai, has two kilometres of wharfage and is available with a Free Trade Zone. Container ro-ro facilities and cold stores are also available at Jebel Ali.

Sharjah's Port Khalid has 11 berths with container and ro-ro facilities. Port Khalid also has a Free Trade Zone. Sharjah's east coast territory of Khor Fakkan has a container terminal.

Ras al-Khaimah has an eight-berth port which is used mainly for the export of cement and aggregate. Fujairah port was built in 1982. One major US shipping line already uses the port on a regular basis and it is hoped to attract others when extension to the berthing facilities, corrently under way, is completed.

Methods of doing business



General

Abu Dhabi Before Abu Dhabi's development got under way local businesspeople had little experience of international trading. This has changed dramatically since the oil boom began and most local companies now employ expatriate businesspeople to run their operations. The oil price crash in the mid-1980's brought about a much needed shake-out in the business sector and the practice of non-specialised agency collecting is quickly becoming unfashionable, particularly amongst the longer-established trading companies, many of which are beginning to specialise - in the sense of concentrating on their strengths. There are now competent local agents in Abu Dhabi for most products and services, although the market is still oil-sector dominated.

Overseas principals must nevertheless pay close attention to their local agents — who respond to and work better for those principals who visit regularly and show an active and continuing interest in this market. Given the predominance of tendering as a purchasing policy amongst the oil companies and government departments, UK companies must make a point of urging their local agents to monitor tenders closely, and to respond quickly and, whenever possible, positively when tender enquiries are referred to them.

Large orders in this market are sometimes lost because representatives of British firms do not have the necessary authority to sign on behalf of their companies. Manufacturers should therefore ensure that their representatives are empowered to make the final decision and preferably they should carry a letter to this effect. In this market there are often special circumstances which call for some slight adaptation of the product. Manufacturers should be prepared to do this, should the potential warrant it, and their representative be empowered to negotiate accordingly. Orders in this market may sometimes take longer to conclude than elsewhere; and business visitors should

arrange their visit to the area, so that their stay in Abu Dhabi can be extended, should this be necessary.

The Northern Emirates Local merchants are well acquainted with methods of financing foreign trade, and in this respect, even by European standards, are sophisticated. They have an acute business sense, and their reputation for business morality has on the whole been high. The more far-sighted merchants are aware that their future lies in diversifying. They are anxious to obtain as much as possible of the new business in more sophisticated lines such as plant and machinery.

Most firms now employ Levantine, Indian, and European managers, but expertise and technical knowledge is still at a premium. A large number of new businesses have been opened in the past few years, some of which have brought in more aggressive sales technique to challenge the older-established merchants.

Due to the increasing number of visitors, great pressure is being placed on the traditional Arab informality in business and visitors should, where possible, make appointments with merchants in advance. Business visitors should make every effort to spend at least three to four working days in this market.

The Northern Emirates, particularly Dubai, still offer plenty of opportunities to British exporters.

Appointments of agents

An agent may cover one Emirate or sometimes a group of Emirates (particularly Dubai and the smaller Northern Emirates). Whilst local firms with branches in Dubai and Abu Dhabi can theoretically cover the whole area effectively, exporters should seriously consider whether their interests would be better served by having a different agent in each market in view of their separate characteristics. Firms who are considering a single agent for the UAE should first consult one of the Regional Offices of the Department of Trade and Industry (see pages 96-99) or the Embassy, also Oteneas status information on page 49 and Overseas Trade Division on page 84.

Agency legislation

abu dhabi

The Federal Law on commercial agencies effective from 11 February 1982, and amended by Federal Law 14 of 1988, unifies the law and practice in each Emirate.

Only companies registered with the Federal Ministry of Economy and Commerce are entitled to act as agents.

All agents must be UAE nationals or companies wholly owned by UAE nationals.

For an agreement to be valid there must be a direct written agreement between the agent and the principal to the exclusion of others in the designated area.

Care should be taken in the selection and initial appointment of agents, because subsequent change can prove to be difficult and costly. For further information firms should contact the UAE desk at Overseas Trade Division (OTD) (see page 84) or the British Embassy at Abu Dhabi or Dubai.


Federal Commercial Law

This law came into effect in 1984. Its main points are:

- (a) Every company formed in the UAE must have one or more members who are UAE nationals and whose total share is not less than 51 per cent of its capital. The only exception to this rule is for commercial agencies which must be 100 per cent locally owned.
- (b) All businesses in the UAE, with the sole exception of very small 'sug' (corner shop) concerns, must have one of the following forms; public shareholding company, private shareholding company, limited liability company, simple partnership, simple limited partnership, share partnership, joint ventures or branches. Further details are available from Overseas Trade Division (OTD), Department of Trade and Industry (see page 84), or from the British Embassy, Abu Dhabi or Dubai.

Overseas status information

Reports on the suitability-for-purpose of local firms as potential representatives or partners (joint venture or manufacture-under-licence) of British manufacturers can be obtained through the Overseas Trade Division of the Department of Trade and Industry (see page 84). There is a charge for each report.



These reports are essentially not financial; and do not include credit assessments. Firms can also obtain reports, including credit assessments, from banks, credit enquiry agencies, protection societies and other similar institutions based in the United Kingdom.

Correspondence and trade literature

Ideally, correspondence and trade literature should be in Arabic as well as English, but the latter is read widely.

Should a large amount of trade literature be required by a business visitor, it is advisable for him to mail a supply by air to his hotel well in advance.

Terms of payment

Irrevocable letter of credit terms are normal, although cad terms are usually acceptable once satisfactory business relations with the local firm have been established.

Patents and trade marks

There is no written patent or trade mark law in the UAE. However, Federal Legislation is planned and there is some protection for trademarked goods through the offices of local Chambers of Commerce, if they are the subject of an exclusive agency agreement. Further protection may be obtained by the insertion of cautionary notices in the local press.

Ras al-Khaimah is alone in having its own trade mark law which was promulgated in 1974.

Price quotations

Prices should be quoted cif or c&f Abu Dhabi or Dubai. (See also Incoterns, under Other Sources, on page 93.)

Buying seasons

Capital goods are purchased throughout the year. The buving season for consumer goods tends to be at the beginning of the summer months (April to June), but this preference has much less significance than in previous years.

Advertising

British exporters are advised to consult their advertising agents, before embarking on an advertising campaign in the Emirates

Press There are a number of newspapers, both in Arabic or English; and they all accept commercial advertising. There is no specialist trade press as yet. Exporters wishing to advertise locally should contact Overseas Trade Division (OTD) (see page 84) for details of these publications.

Cinema The cinemas which show Indian films are closing, due to falling attendance brought about by the growth of the video industry.

Commercial radio and television Abu Dhabi Radio, PO Box 63, Abu Dhabi, broadcasts in English and Arabic for about 18 hours daily. Capital Radio, PO Box 6845, Abu Dhabi, broadcasts in English for about 17 hours daily. They accept commercial advertising.

Abu Dhabi Television, PO Box 637, Abu Dhabi, transmits in colour from Abu Dhabi and Al Ain. Transmissions can be received in all the Emirates and in parts of Oman and Qatar. The station is on the air for about eight hours daily. Advertising rates are reasonable and can be arranged through the above address.

UAE Radio, Dubai, ¹ O Box 1695, Dubai, broadcasts a total of 18½ hours a day in the Arabic language. FM broadcasts from the station are effectively received in Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Kuwait, Iran, Syria, Jordan and the Lebanon.

The FM service, in English, broadcasts music, request programmes etc., and news bulletins are carried at 07.30, 14.30 and 20.30. Advertising is accepted by both the Arabic and the English language stations.

There are also radio stations in Ras al-Khaimah and Umm al-Quwain.

Dubai's colour television service can be received throughout the Gulf States, Iran and areas of Saudi Arabia. The station also transmits on UHF. Apart from the Arabic channel, there is a separate English language channel which shows mainly imported British and American programmes. Both channels ac ept advertising.

Dubai TV and Radio advertising can be received in Abu Dhabi, though quality of reception is variable. Programmes from Qatar, Bahrain and Bandar Abbas are also received in the summer months.

Sharjah opened a colour television station in February 1989.

Exhibition Commercial and Information Officers of the British Embassy are prepared to advise British representatives in arranging special exhibitions of their products.

Trade fairs

A large number of specialised exhibitions are taking place at the Dubai Trade Centre, a purpose-built site for international fairs. The Centre is run by the Trade Centre Management Company, PO Box 9292, Dubai, UAE; tel: 472200. Exhibition facilities are also available at Abu Dhabi and Sharjah, but so far these have been used mainly for local events.

Details of all important exhibitions are published quarterly in the "Promotions Guide", a special supplement to Overseas Trade magazine.

Part 2 Oman

General information

Background

Onian has been ruled by Sultan Qaboos bin Said since 1970. The country has no parliamentary system. A State Consultative Council was formed in 1981 to increase participation of the Oniani people. Its members are appointed by the Sultan. Onian is a member of the Gulf Co-operation Council.

Area and geographical features

The Sultanate of Oman, situated at the eastern corner of the Arabian peninsula is larger than the states of the Lower Gulf, covering an area of 300,000 square kms. Its coastline is 1,700 kms long and extends from the Ras al-Khaimah Sheikhdom near Bukha on the west side of the Musandam Peninsula to Bay'ah on the east, and from near the Sharjah dependency of Kriba to Ras Darbat Ali, where the province of Dhofar borders on the former People's Democratic Republic of Yemen, now amalgamated with the Yemen Arab Republic. Oman also borders on the United Arab Emirates and Saudi Arabia.

Population

No population census has been taken in Oman. A sample survey has been conducted in five towns only, hence precise population figures are not available. For government planning purposes, the population is assumed to be 1.5 million.

Principal towns

The capital area, stretching from Muscat through Mutrah and Ruwi to Seeb, has a population of between 250,000-300,000 which includes a large number of immigrant workers, mainly from India and Pakistan. Other towns include Sur, Nazwa and Sohar in the north (which tend to purchase via local offices of

Muscat-based agents) and Salalah (the only other centre of commercial interest) in the southern region of Dhofar.

Climate

For about four months, from December to the end of March, the climate is pleasant with temperatures ranging from 16°C (61°F) to 32°C (90°F). From April to October it can be exceedingly hot and damp, the worst months being May, June and July when the midday temperatures may reach 47°C (117°F) on the coast and humidity is over 85 per cent. The average rainfall in the Muscat area is about 93 millimetres, but is somewhat higher at Nazwa. Salalah enjoys light monsoon rain from late June to September.

The best time to visit the area is from September to March; not only is the climate then more tolerable for visitors, but many merchants are away from Muscat for long periods during the hot summer months. (See also Official public holidays, pages 58-59.)

Clothing

From the end of November to the end of March, medium-weight clothing is suitable, with cardigans sometimes worn for comfort during winter evenings. For the remainder of the year, and especially during May, June and July, men should wear cotton shirts and slacks.

Women will find loose-fitting silk or cotton dresses the most comfortable. Women should avoid dressing in a manner which will offend local susceptibles (e.g. bare shoulders). Similarly, men should not wear shorts in summer. Evening dress is worn only on the more formal occasions.

Language

The official language is Arabic, but English is widely spoken in business and government circles. If a merchant does not speak English, he is likely to have an interpreter at hand.

Weights and measures

The metric system is in operation. Transactions in other measurements are illegal.

Social customs

Business visitors are recommended to seek the advice of the British commercial officer, regarding local social customs.

Health

Dysentry, TB, and eye diseases are endemic, but with normal precautions Europeans seldom suffer from more than upset stomachs. It is advisable to take anti-malarial tablets just before, during and after a visit to Oman. There are small hospitals in all provincial centres.

Electricity supply

The electricity supply is 220/240 volts, 50 cycles, single or three-phase. Plug fittings are generally three-pin flat. Lamp fittings are usually the bayonet type.

Religion

The main religion is Islam, of which the Ibadi rite is the official form. About a quarter of the population are Sunni Moslems; there are also some Shias and others.

Official public holidays

Friday is the main weekly holiday. Government offices are also closed on Thursday. Saturday and Sunday are normal working days.

Business representatives are advised to avoid visiting Oman during the month of Ramadan which ends with a four-day holiday (Eid al-Fitr).

The holidays marked with an asterisk are dependent on the Moslem lunar calendar and may differ by one or two days from the dates given. Information may be checked with the Oman Embassy, 44a Montpelier Square, London SW7; tel: 071-584 6782; fax: 071-225 0339, during the two months preceding a holiday. The Moslem year which begins on 26 August has only 354 or 355 days, so Moslem dates and holidays fall 10 to 12 days earlier each year on the Gregorian calendar.

Local time is four hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time.

Travel



Passports and visas

Business visitors may obtain short visas valid for stays of up to two weeks from Omani Embassies and Consulates abroad. The Omani Embassy in London is at 44a-44b Montpelier Square, London SW7 1JJ; (tel: 071-584 6782; telex: 918775 OMANYA G). Visas will normally be issued within five days. No sponsor will be required. Business visitors wishing to enter the country by road from the United Arab Emirates will be able to obtain visas from the Immigration Department Office at Buraimi or from the Omani Office in Dubai. Visas will be issued in cases of emergency on the day of application subject to applications being received by 09.00 hours. Transit visas are issued principally for persons whose journey is disrupted by circumstances beyond their control. Such visas are valid for twentyfour hours.

If a traveller's passport bears evidence of a visit or a proposed visit to Israel, Libya, South Africa or possibly the PDRY, it will be necessary to obtain a new passport to visit the Sultanate of Oman. Travellers who are likely to be affected by this situation should consult their nearest regional Passport Office in London, Liverpool, Glasgow, Newport (Gwent), Peterborough, Belfast, or if overseas, the nearest British Consulate or High Commission.

Documentation for travel to other Middle East

Visitors intending to go to other Middle East countries are strongly advised to obtain, before leaving Britain, any visa or other documentation which may be required.

Health regulations

International Certificates of vaccination against smallpox and cholera are not required. A check should be made with the airline/travel agent about current health requirements.

Currency

The unit of currency in the Sultanate of Oman is the Rial Omani (RO) comprising 1000 Baizas.

Notes are issued in the denominations of RO 50, 20, 10, 5, 1, 0.500, 0.250, 0.200, 0.100 and coins in 500, 250, 100, 50, 25, 10, 5 and 0.200 Baiza pieces.

Exporters should consult their banks for the current rate of exchange.

Internationally recognised credit cards are accepted, mainly in hotels, but also in some shops and restaurants.

Currency regulations

There are no restrictions on the amount of currency which may be taken into or out of Oman.

Customs formalities

Normally, no customs duties are levied on used personal effects. Duty is payable on items which the customs authorities consider are not part of a visitor's essential for travelling. Samples may be taken into the Sultanate by visitors provided they are declared as such and are produced again before departure, but it is at the discretion of the customs officials as to whether duty be charged on samples accompanying a visitor. (See Samples on page 75.) See also note on videos in Censorship section, page 74.

Income tax clearance

No income tax clearance certificate is required on departure from Oman.


Travel in Oman

Taxis operate in the Capital area (Muscat/Mutrah/Ruwi/Seeb Airport). A scale of charges is displayed at the airport, but is not rigidly adhered to; and fares are subject to negotiation, preferably in advance of the journey.

Traffic travels on the right-hand side of the road. Self and chauffeur driven car-hire facilities are available.

An urban bus service is in operation, but is not recommended for United Kingdom visitors.

There is also an express bus service linking Muscat with Salalah, 1,200 kms to the south (10 hours by road).

British exporters are advised to despatch all mail by air.

There is a radio-telephone link between Muscat and the Gulf ports, London and other European capitals. The charge for a telephone call to Britain is RO 4.8 for three minutes (minimum) and RO 1.6 for each additional minute. (Between 9pm and 6am there is a 25 per cent reduction in cost).

The international code to be dialled from Oman is 00 44 (then drop the first zero from the UK code, e.g. 071-215 4388 becomes 00 44 71 215 4388).

Economic factors



General

Before the accession of the present Sultan in 1970, Oman was a backward, almost medieval state, possessing just 10 kins of asphalted road, three schools and one hospital. Rapid strides have been made since then and today, Oman boasts most of the elements of a modern infrastructure, including a University, 650 schools, 12 hospitals and a stock exchange.

This rapid development was made possible by oil, which was first produced in commercial quantities in 1967. Oman's reserves of oil were estimated to be 4.2 billion barrels in 1989, which are set to last another 20 years or so at current rates of production.

Oman's economy is heavily dependent upon oil. It accounted for 78 per cent of government revenues in 1989 and 45 per cent of GDP and 95 per cent of export receipts in 1988. Fluctuations in the price of oil have had a direct effect upon the economy. The country has weathered the oil price shocks of the mid-eighties better than most of its neighbours, owing in part to prudent economic management by the Oman Government. Reduced oil revenues have set a premium on diversification of the economy away from oil into agriculture, fisheries and industrialisation. Providing employment for the country's rapidly growing population is an economic and social imperative.

Development plans in all key sectors are currently in progress, with the aim of creating a rolling 10-year National Development Plan for 1991-2000. Major opportunities are likely to be in the oil and gas, power generation, water and sewerage, agriculture and fisheries sectors. Consumer goods, education and health care will also offer opportunities for exporters.

Britain has enjoyed an especially close relationship with Oman which dates back to the 17th century. British products and services have done well in Oman and the United Kingdom enjoys one of its highest market shares there anywhere in the world.

Import and exchange control regulations



The latest available information about import duties, import regulations, taxes, and any other legislation in the Sultanate of Oman affecting British exports, may be obtained from the Overseas Trade Division (OTD), Department of Trade and Industry (see page 84).

Export licensing

The export of most goods from the United Kingdom is unrestricted, but some items are subject to control, sometimes temporarily. Exporters should check the current position with the DTI's Export Control Organisation at Kingsgate House, 68-74 Victoria Street, London SW1E 6SW; tel: 071-215 8020/8032; telex: 936069 DTIKH G: fax: 071-215 8521.

Import licensing

Import licences are required only for alcoholic drinks, fire-arms, narcotics, explosives and a few other restricted or prohibited items.

Customs duty

Customs duties are levied on the c&f value. The rate of duty on most items is five per cent. Protective tariffs are granted to local manufacturers, but some goods such as certain foodstuffs are exempt from duty. Goods produced in member countries of the Gulf Cooperation Council (with some exceptions) are duty-free, subject to production of Certificate of Origin.

Censorship

In the interests of preserving public morals and in conformity with the ideals of the State, Royal Decree 45/76 introduced censorship on films (including trade, advertising etc.), sound-tracks, tape-recordings, records, stage shows, public broadcasts and advertising for any of these. It also required all foreign language films to have Arabic subtitles before they can be shown in the Sultanate.

All books and other publications should be submitted to the Ministry of Information and Culture, before being sold or distributed in the Sultanate. Video cassettes are also subject to censorship.

Quarantine

Royal decrees have been issued, empowering the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries, Petroleum and Minerals to impose quarantine restrictions on:

- (i) Animals and animal products and various items of animal equipment;
- (ii) Plants and plant products, soil, seeds etc.

Samples

Samples brought into the country are liable to duty, the same as any other goods.

Bona fide unsaleable commercial samples, in reasonable quantities, may be sent by post or as air freight and no duty is charged. Such samples should have a declaration that they are samples. (See also

Customs formalities on page 61).

With the exception of a few items, import duties in Oman are levied at five per cent. For samples of high value, e.g. jewellery, the value of the bank guarantee necessary is calculated on the basis of the appropriate duty. Arrangements should be made for a bank in Oman (see list of banks on pages 71-73) to issue a guarantee in Rials Omani, which should be given, with an itemised list (in duplicate) of the samples, to the customs officer on arrival. On departure, the items will be checked against a copy of the list and customs duty must then be paid on the items not re-exported. The bank guarantee will then be given back to the returning visitor.

Importers/agents

Names and addresses of importers/agents in Oman are held in the Overseas Trade Division (OTD) of the Department of Trade and Industry. Exporters wishing to use this service can do so by contacting this Division, the full address of which is on page 84.

Documentation

A commercial invoice and an Arab-British Chamber of Commerce Certificate of Origin are required for the export of goods to Oman. The commercial invoice must be a supplier's invoice and may not originate from agents or representatives of importers. It should be a supplier's certified statement of origin.

The commercial invoice and certificate of origin must be legalised by the Oman Embassy in London.

Further information on documentation regulations can be obtained from OTD (see page 84).

Parcel post import regulations

The postal authorities are required to deliver a statement to the customs within 24 hours of arrival of the mail. Postal parcels will be examined and assessed by an appraiser, and if it appears that the value of the parcel is intentionally falsely declared by the sender, the parcel will be confiscated and released only on payment of the customs duties, plus a fine.

Port and warehouse facilities

If goods cannot be cleared at once, they are kept free of charge in the customs warehouse for five days, after which demurrage is levied. Storage space in the customs warehouse is adequate for medium-size consignments, but large consignments are left in the open until they are collected.

Methods of doing business



Appointment of agents

Oman is a small market for many commodities. It is often difficult to find agents with technical staff capable of dealing with other than simple problems, but this situation is improving. Any of the Regional Offices of the Department of Trade and Industry (see pages 96-99) can help with the appointment of agents (see also Overseas status information on page 78).

Agency legislation

Royal Decree 26/77 dealing with the Commercial Agencies Law, issued on 9 May 1977, governs the rules and regulation, to be followed by local firms importing goods into Oman or operating a Commercial Agencies business.

All companies engaging in Agency type business must be registered and have their principal office in Oman, and Omanis must hold at least 51 per cent of the company's shares.

The law empowers the Minister for Commerce and Industry to ban products and merchandis, of manufacturers and suppliers who do not have an independent commercial agent.

An official translation of the decree may be obtained from Overseas Trade Division (OTD) (see page 84).

With effect from 1 December 1978, the Ministry of Commerce and Industry introduced a regulation whereby only Registered Traders will have the authority to import goods.

All importers are required to produce the following documents with their completed Bill of Entry:

- 1. An Import Registration Certificate;
- 2. A Commercial Registration Certificate;
- 3. A Sole-Agency Certificate for automobiles, machinery, electric and electronic items.

Any importer who is unable to produce the necessary certificates or quote the reference numbers will be unable to clear his goods.

Visits by British principals and representatives British business visitors to Muscat are encouraged to call at the British Embassy, if they require assistance. The number of callers is large, and business representatives are advised to telephone for an appointment to avoid unnecessary waiting.

Price quotations

Prices should be quoted c&f Muscat or Salalah, as appropriate. (See also *Incoterms*, under *Other Sounes*, on page 93.)

Buying seasons

There are no clearly defined buying seasons for capital or consumer goods.

Overseas status information

Reports on the suitability-for-purpose of local firms as potential representatives or partners (joint venture or manufacture-under-licence) of British manufacturers can be obtained through the Overseas Trade Division (OTD), Department of Trade and Industry (see page 84). There is a charge for each report.

These reports are essentially not financial; and do not include credit assessments. Firms can also obtain reports, including credit assessments, from banks, credit enquiry agencies, protection societies and other similar institutions based in the United Kingdom.

It should be noted, however, that the Oman Banking Law of 1974 forbids disclosure of such information without the consent of the customer.

Correspondence and trade literature

Corespondence and trade literature in English is acceptable, but trade literature in both English and Arabic is preferable.

Should a large amount of trade literature be required by a business visitor, it is advisable for a supply to be forwarded by air to the visitor's hotel in advance of his or her arrival.

Terms of payment

Irrevocable letter of credit terms are normal and cad terms are common, but there is an increasing tendency for credit terms to be granted to the more established importers.

Debt collection and disputes

Disputes are dealt with by the Authority for Settlement of Commercial Disputes (ASCD) which is an independent tribunal. There is also an appeal mechanism.

It is not part of the responsibility of the British commercial officers to collect debts, but some assistance is given with such problems when possible. The banks are also helpful in these matters.

Patents and trade marks

A new trade mark law came into effect on 1 January 1987, Registration of trade marks is dealt with by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.

Advertising

British exporters are advised to consult their advertising agents, before embarking on an advertising campaign. There are several advertising agencies in Muscat and advertising is permitted in the press and on television.

Fruit Boom on the Gulf

It's summer on the Gulf, with its customary seasonal temperatures of 40°C (104°F) plus. The tap water has a permanent tang of petroleum about it. After all, oil is the kingdom's principal source of income, and the main deposits are located around the twin cities of Dhahran/Damman on the east coast.

The fruit trade has a relatively long tradition in this part of the country, because oil prospecting and extraction has always attracted foreigners - Americans and British, Pakistanis, Indians, Filipinos and Koreans. Al-Jishi Establishments is one of the kingdom's ten largest fruit importing companies. The firm's founder, Hussain Ahmed Avdul Latif Al-Jishi, has been involved in the fruit trade for forty years. In 1958 he had a little store in Qatif, a small town north of Dammain. He moved to Dammain in 1963 and opened a wholesale and retail trading firm at the central wholesale market there. Al-Jishi has been running his own import operation for exactly 20 years. That is not something to be taken lightly. You need a knowledge of languages and worldwide connections. Jaafar Usman, Import Manager: "Summer is high season for fruit here, with demand focusing mainly on watermelons, oranges and mangoes. Stone fruit such as cherries, plums, apples and peaches are also moving very well right now. We import our supplies by air, sea and land." The list of countries he sources from spans the globe: "Fruit from Australia, Holland, Cyprus, Greece, Egypt, India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Kenya comes by air. The produce is trucked in from Dubai, Lebanon, Tunisia, Jordan, Turkey, Syria and Bahrain." Fruit and vegetables from China, Taiwan, India and Iran are reexported through Dubai and Bahrain. Merchandise comes from India and Sri Lanka by sea. Al-Jishi is Saudi Arabian agent for the Farzana Trading Company in Dubai. Most of the fruit that is reexported comes from Iran and India and includes ginger, garlic, onions, Iranian melons and watermelons, Iranian apples and Indian mangoes. Substantial volumes of lemons are imported from Spain. Al-Jishi sells to the other wholesalers who lack import

Al-Jishi sells to the other wholesalers who lack import facilities of their own, and also supplies supermarkets and retailers in the surrounding towns and villages as well as hotels. Jaafar Usman: "The market has changed in our favour since the 1980s. We are particularly happy with the last three years and hope we'll be able to maintain business on the same high level." What are the firm's plans for the future? Usman: "We've built a new coldstore and will be taking in large shipments of apples, oranges and bananas by sea in the near future."

Bananas in the Gulf

Banana imports in the Gulf area are rising. This is the result of increased production of dollar bananas in Central and South America, says Malinood M. A. Khan, Dubai. 10 million cases were unloaded in the Gulf region (Sharjah, Qatar, Dammam, Bahrain, Kuwait and Bandar Abbas) in 1991, rising to 15.8 m boxes in 1992. The most important single port of arrival was Bandar Abbas, Iran, with 4.2 m in 1991 and 9.5 m in 1992. Chiquita enjeved a market share of 49.1% in 1991 with 4.9 m boxes, edging up to 50.3% with 8 m cases in 1992. Second in the running is Dole with 28% in 1991 and 27.8% in 1992.

Available statistics show that the Gulf region imported 17 m boxes from January to the end of June this year (13.6 m during the same period last year). Chiquita accounted for 4.5 (5 m the previous year), Del Monte 4 m (1.8 m), Dole 4.1 m (3.2 m) and Sumitomo 756,512 (412,339). Newcomers to the Gulf market are Reybanpac (Ecuador), Bonita and other suppliers with 2.9 m cases. Uniban and Banacol have lost considerable market shares. Their sendings fell from 3.9 m boxes in the previous year's half-year to 612,326 for the first six months of 1993. They may still make up lost ground in the second half of the year. Reybanpac has just opened an office in Iran.

Statistics show that the traditional market leader Chiquita, with its subsidiary brands "Chico" and "Amigo" and a comfortable 50% market share, need not fear even substantial competition from small suppliers. Mahmood Khan: "I imagine the explosive growth of outsiders is due to overproduction."







Pasir Panjang – a Clean Market

In a city-state like Singapore where throwing a cigarette butt on the ground invites a heavy fine and a thief receives 30 strokes of the cane on top of a jail sentence, the wholesale market is a paragon of organization and cleanliness. Pasir Panjang was built in 1983 on 14 hectares (57 acres) of reclaimed land at a cost of US\$40 million. The complex consists of the fruit, vegetable, dry-goods and coldstore sector with 241 large and 352 small market stands plus 476 cooling cells. The office building houses 24 firms, a bank and a ground-floor cafeteria. Market management does not follow the customary pattern. According to its director Yian Hong Koh, the Em Services company collects the stand rents on behalf of the Singapore Housing and Development Board and is responsible for cleaning the premises.

Over 30 firms and more than 80% of the city-state's importers are members of the Singapore Fruits Importers and Exporters Exchange. *Huat Lik Tan*, chairman: "We buy major items like citrus, apples, table grapes and pears from Australia, France, Japan and the United States jointly." Tony Tan, director, adds: "Trade is increasing. Consumers are becoming more health-conscious." Singapore lost its hinterland, Malaysia, when with a burgeoning economy that country began handling its imports itself. The cooperative's US\$3 million volume of imports therefore goes largely to the home market.

One-hundred percent of shipments from all over the world reach Singapore by container. Apples are palletized in the box, everything else is shipped loose. Huat Lik Tan says the largest single item is the approximately 300 containers with mainly red apples, citrus and table grapes from the United States.

H. Siang Tan, director of the Yew Say company, is happy with developments in Asia on the whole. "Competition is tough." He nevertheless describes Hong Kong as the trading hub for the northern part and Singapore for the southern part of South Asia. "We have been agents for

Jaffa since 1965 and for Pardess since 1991. We did good business with Israel till 1975", says Tan. The competition battle now takes place in the media. "Florida grapefruit and Sunkist oranges appear in commercials." And – consumers are becoming more quality-conscious.

"The best pears grow in China", affirms Yeouw Hua (Peter) Tan, manager of Teck Kee Company. "We used to import pears from Australia. Now the People's Republic is our chief supplier." Teck Kee has entered into a long-term joint venture with suppliers in Sinkiang and Hubei. "The enormous distances are a problem", Peter Tan concedes. The sensitive produce is packed in boxes in the firm's own packing house and then sets off on a two-week haul to Hong Kong followed by three and a half days by container to Singapore. "On this count, mandarins are easy. They grow in Guangdong province right next to Hong Kong and are stowed in containers on the spot." 30% of the merchandise stays in the city-state and 70% is reexported to Malaysia, Indonesia and the Philippines. Teck Kee imported 2,000 tonnes pears, 1,200 t melons and 3,500 t mandarins in 1992. At the end of the interview, Yeow Hua Tan gave your reporter a tip: "Try the best pear - the paradise pear!" This is a small aromatic lightly textured fruit which is supplied from China in January and February.

Khiam Back Tay of the Hupco'company packs apples, pears, mandarins and stonefruit under the "Fortune" label depicting a leaping stag. Hupco maintains a stand at Pasir Panjang as well as a distribution centre on Teck Guan Street, formerly a fruit-trading centre. Vestiges of

this activity can still be observed in the market atmosphere on the edge of the world's cleanest city.

Eng Cheong Peng Kee is a long-established import company. Mike K. G. Low, director, says the age of the supermarket has now dawned in Singapore as well. "Fruits from temperate regions like apples and pears are exotics for us. Subtropical and tropical fruits are cultivated in this area. Supplies from Malaysia and Thailand are not really imports in the strict sense because they are trucked down here over the road network of the Malay peninsula." The fitte reexports 20-25% of imports. "The percentage has got smaller. Singapore is concentrating more on itself", says Low. And goes on: "The range is shifting in favour of tropical fruits." That has directly to do with disposable income, the housewife's purse.

Though *Tony K. H. Chua* of Chit Hong & Co. in Singapore's old Chinese quarter imports fruit and vegetables from Australia, France, Japan and the US, his main stemping-ground is China. Chua can look back on 25 years of contacts with suppliers there. The 2,000 40-foot containers he brings in from China are filled largely with products from the People's Republic – ya pears from Hebei province, chang-pa and Shandong or fragrant pears from Sinkiang or mandarins from Guangdong next door to Hong Kong. Chua says his suppliers in China are mostly state enterprises. "There's still a considerable state presence in agriculture."

Primary Industries in the slaughterhouse centre west of Singapore is also state-controlled. Besides beef, goat meat and lamb, Primary also distributes fifty kinds of fruit and vegetables to the tune of 200 t a month. *Dr Pow-Chow Leong*, manager of the fruit and vegetable section, imports mainly through agents in Australia, New Zealand and Europe as well as Indonesia, Pakistan, India



and China. The volume of imports runs to a value of US\$250 million and breaks down into 60% fruits and 40% vegetables.

The Seasonal Produce Commission House sources onions, shallots and potatoes from all over the world. Director Chin Huat Lim names Holland, Britain, India, Pakistan and the United States – above all Oregon – as supplier countries. The southern hemisphere is represented by Tasmania and New Zealand.

Durians (Durio zibethinus) on Singapore market. Chinese in particular prize the fruit as an alleged aphrodisiac.





Hong Kong – One Huge Emporium

Chris Patten, Governor of the Crown Colony of Hong Kong, said in his address on the occasion of the Chinese New Year: "Hong Kong bucked all world-market trends in 1992 by pursuing its unbroken economic expansion with a 5% growth rate." This was without a doubt also a political statement, because north of Sheung Shui, the border post with the People's Republic of China, and especially in Beijing, the crown colony is observed with growing irritation. China labels everything the British governor intends to do before the handover of power in 1997 - liberalization and democratization, not to mention the construction of a major new airport in the New Territories - as "meddling in its internal affairs" and a "violation of the Memorandum of Understanding negotiated with the United Kingdom in 1991". Behind all this is China's uncertainty as to what is going to happen with this vibrantly dynamic 1,000 km² (400 square mile) economic giant anyway.

Across the border, a return to a more quiescent age of simply tending the fields is out of the question if for no other reason than that, around Hong Kong, a highly

developed industrial belt has sprung up which has generated its own dynamics and is largely immune to political decisionmaking.

A "spot market" for fruit and vegetables

For countless foreign tourists, Hong Kong and more particularly the Kowloon peninsula is one gigantic shopping centre where impulse or "spot" deals ("see it - buy it") predominate. It is the same with the fruit and vegetable trade. One reason for this is the level of population, which at 5.9 million is relatively quickly saturated. Another is that "day-to-day deals" are very much in keeping with the spirit of Hong Kong, and buyers act accordingly. For this reason, and also because of the above-mentioned limited capacity of the market, almost all fruit and vegetables come in containers. Furthermore, the colony also acts as a buffer and repacking centre for produce from the neighbouring Chinese province of Guangdong (Canton). The belt encircling Hong Kong is not just an industrial phenomenon: it is also a source of, in particular, excellent mandarin oranges. Refrigerated railway wagons haul vegetables and pears from the Chinese interior. They are repacked, loaded into containers and distributed throughout the entire region, particularly wherever overseas Chinese live.

Multilayered import market

Hong Kong is above all a Chinese market. In other words, the fruit must look bright and colourful and be sweet to the taste. The sweeter the Red Delicious or grape, the better. Australian Fuji apples are also popular. Recent years have even seen the development of a limited

potential for yellow and green apples. In citrus, shoppers go first and foremost for what they know: mandarins or tangerine-type products, but now also Navels and Valencias from Caifornia, which are intensively promoted. The market for grapefruit is small: the white variety is too acidic for the Chinese taste and the sweet Ruby Red is not known. Despite its Chinese origins, the kiwifruit has never made any headway. Is it because it is too ugly-looking?

The lunar New Year (which fell on 23 January this year) is the biggest Chinese festival of them all, comparable to Christmas in the West. It is also a consumer event. As the holiday approaches, fruit and vegetable suppliers' hearts throughout the entire Pacific area beat faster, because it always marks a high point in the consumption of their products. Demand extends to the exotics, including the hypertrophic Fuji apple which weighs in at 600-700 g: lovingly wrapped, it passes over the counter for a few Hong Kong dollars.

Silco International is one of the firms that imports almost every product in the fruit and vegetable range regardless of Chinese tastes. The firm's headquarters are within view of Kai Tak airport, one of the busiest in East Asia with 1,600 take-offs and landings. Silco was founded in 1965, since when it has carved out a role as a supplier of airline companies, restaurants, hotels and other large-scale up-market caterers. "That means one thing and one thing only: quality – top quality", says Eddy Lee Oi Tak, Silco's sales manager. Naturally, Silco also imports meat, poultry, eggs and cheese.

Sheung RES

P&C Trading is a buffer company between China and the local region, one of many in Hong Kong. P&C chief Plato Cheung says these companies have cultivated contacts with agricultural enterprises in Guangdong province for years. They have t'e produce packed to "western" standards and reexport most of it. Cheung has intensified this collaboration. He is linked directly to production at Po Leng, a city about 400 km (240 miles) distant through his new firm Agrico, a joint venture with partners in the People's Republic. Agrico supplies mostly mandarins and garlic, the latter from Hebei province.

A glance at Macau

Macau, 65 km (40 miles) to the west on the estuary of the Pearl River, is in a somewhat similar situation to Hong Kong. The colony's 500,000 inhabitants, 97% of them Chinese, owe their existence mainly to its casinos. Macau is ruled by a governor appointed by the Portuguese president. Chinese is the language of general use; Portuguese is limited to official purposes. Macau is due to revert to China two years after Hong Kong, ie in 1999. The loss of Macau as an international zone and gambling centre would be a severe blow to the Chinese. Fruit and vegetables are imported via Hong Kong; occasional direct deliveries from China come across the border which cuts through the town across the peninula. As in Hong Kong, the accent in fruit consumption is on apples and citrus fruit.
