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PREFACE

The Tanzania Coastal Management Partnership (TCMP) established Science and Technical Working Group (STWG) in July 1999. TCMP is a joint initiative between the Government of Tanzania, the National Environmental Management Council, the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the Coastal Resources Center (CRC) of the University of Rhode Island (URI). The main goal of TCMP is to establish the foundation for effective coastal management in Tanzania. TCMP is committed to working with the existing network of Integrated Coastal Management (ICM) programme and practitioners to facilitate a participatory transparent process to unite the Government and the community, science and management, sectoral and public interests with a primary goal of conservation and development of coastal ecosystems and resource. STWG is intended to provide the primary bridge between coastal managers and the science community studying coastal marine issues at the local and national level. More specifically, STWG provides a clearinghouse mechanism for the integration of science and better coastal management. The Institute of Marine Sciences (IMS) of the University of Dar es Salaam provides the Secretariat to the STWG and the IMS Director is the Chairperson of the Group.

Numerous marine studies have been conducted in Tanzania for the past few decades. Some of the results were published in international journals, books, reports, conference and workshop proceedings. However, most of these references are not readily available in Tanzania main Libraries. It was the acknowledgement of this limitation that STWG decided to develop the first Reference Location Guide for Marine Science Literature in Tanzania, as one of its initial activities. This document contains the most complete list of references on marine science literature that has ever been compiled for Tanzania in six natural science themes: shoreline erosion, water quality and pollution, marine fisheries, coral reefs, mangroves and other living marine resources. The list of references was prepared following a comprehensive review of available literature in natural science areas that are important for coastal management in Tanzania. The exact locations of the references (library and reference number) are given where available. Unfortunately some references are still listed as "Not found". The TCMP will continue to support the work of locating the rest of missing references and update the information in future versions of this document. The Reference Location Guide is without doubt a valuable reference material for anyone (both local and international) who is interested with marine sciences. It is also a useful document for University graduate students and resource managers. As a complement to this document, the Annotated Bibliography based on Marine Science Literature in Tanzania and the Synthesis of marine scientific knowledge in Tanzania are also available at IMS and TCMP. Furthermore, as part of the implementation of this project, most of the references previously listed as grey literature were located and photocopied. These references are also available at IMS and TCMP.
